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An act relating to sexual offenders and predators; amending ss. 775.21, 943.0435, and 944.606, F.S.; requiring sexual offenders and predators to provide home telephone numbers and any cellular telephone numbers as part of the registration process; providing an effective Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Paragraph (a) of subsection (6), paragraph (a) Section 1. of subsection (8), and paragraph (a) of subsection (10) of section 775.21, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 775.21 The Florida Sexual Predators Act.--**REGISTRATION.--**A sexual predator must register with the department through the sheriff's office by providing the following information to the department: Name, social security number, age, race, sex, date of birth, height, weight, hair and eye color, photograph, address of legal residence and address of any current temporary residence, within the state or out of state, including a rural route address and a post office box, any electronic mail address and any instant message name required to be provided pursuant to subparagraph (g)4., home telephone number and any cellular telephone number, date and place of any employment, date and place of each conviction, fingerprints, and a brief description of the crime or crimes committed by the offender. 29 box shall not be provided in lieu of a physical residential 30 address.

If the sexual predator's place of residence is a motor 31 a. vehicle, trailer, mobile home, or manufactured home, as defined 32 in chapter 320, the sexual predator shall also provide to the 33 department written notice of the vehicle identification number; 34 35 the license tag number; the registration number; and a description, including color scheme, of the motor vehicle, 36 37 trailer, mobile home, or manufactured home. If a sexual predator's place of residence is a vessel, live-aboard vessel, 38 or houseboat, as defined in chapter 327, the sexual predator 39 shall also provide to the department written notice of the hull 40 identification number; the manufacturer's serial number; the 41 name of the vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat; the 42 registration number; and a description, including color scheme, 43 44 of the vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat.

63 (8) VERIFICATION. -- The department and the Department of Corrections shall implement a system for verifying the addresses 64 65 of sexual predators. The system must be consistent with the provisions of the federal Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety 66 67 Act of 2006 and any other federal standards applicable to such verification or required to be met as a condition for the 68 receipt of federal funds by the state. The Department of 69 70 Corrections shall verify the addresses of sexual predators who 71 are not incarcerated but who reside in the community under the 72 supervision of the Department of Corrections and shall report to the department any failure by a sexual predator to comply with 73 74 registration requirements. County and local law enforcement 75 agencies, in conjunction with the department, shall verify the addresses of sexual predators who are not under the care, 76 77 custody, control, or supervision of the Department of 78 Corrections. Local law enforcement agencies shall report to the 79 department any failure by a sexual predator to comply with 80 registration requirements.

(a) A sexual predator must report in person each year
during the month of the sexual predator's birthday and during
every third month thereafter to the sheriff's office in the
county in which he or she resides or is otherwise located to

If the sexual predator's place of residence is a motor vehicle, trailer, mobile home, or manufactured home, as defined in chapter 320, the sexual predator shall also provide the vehicle identification number; the license tag number; the registration number; and a description, including color scheme, of the motor vehicle, trailer, mobile home, or manufactured

121 (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided, a sexual predator who fails to register; who fails, after registration, 122 123 to maintain, acquire, or renew a driver's license or identification card; who fails to provide required location 124 information, electronic mail address information, instant 125 126 message name information, home telephone number and any cellular 127 telephone number, or change-of-name information; who fails to 128 make a required report in connection with vacating a permanent residence; who fails to reregister as required; who fails to 129 respond to any address verification correspondence from the 130 131 department within 3 weeks of the date of the correspondence; or who otherwise fails, by act or omission, to comply with the 132 133 requirements of this section, commits a felony of the third 134 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 135 775.084.

If the sexual offender is enrolled, employed, or 169 carrying on a vocation at an institution of higher education in this state, the sexual offender shall also provide to the 170 department through the sheriff's office the name, address, and 171 172 county of each institution, including each campus attended, and 173 the sexual offender's enrollment or employment status. Each 174 change in enrollment or employment status shall be reported in person at the sheriff's office, within 48 hours after any change 175 176 in status. The sheriff shall promptly notify each institution of the sexual offender's presence and any change in the sexual 177 offender's enrollment or employment status. 178

When a sexual offender reports at the sheriff's office, the sheriff shall take a photograph and a set of fingerprints of the offender and forward the photographs and fingerprints to the department, along with the information provided by the sexual offender. The sheriff shall promptly provide to the department the information received from the sexual offender.

229 Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section 230 944.606, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

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944.606 Sexual offenders; notification upon release.--

(3) (a) The department must provide information regarding
any sexual offender who is being released after serving a period
of incarceration for any offense, as follows:

The department must provide: the sexual offender's 235 1. name, any change in the offender's name by reason of marriage or 236 237 other legal process, and any alias, if known; the correctional 238 facility from which the sexual offender is released; the sexual 239 offender's social security number, race, sex, date of birth, height, weight, and hair and eye color; date and county of 240 sentence and each crime for which the offender was sentenced; a 241 242 copy of the offender's fingerprints and a digitized photograph taken within 60 days before release; the date of release of the 243 244 sexual offender; any electronic mail address and any instant 245 message name required to be provided pursuant to s. 943.0435(4)(d); telephone number, including any cellular 246 telephone number; and the offender's intended residence address, 247 248 if known. The department shall notify the Department of Law 249 Enforcement if the sexual offender escapes, absconds, or dies. If the sexual offender is in the custody of a private 250 correctional facility, the facility shall take the digitized 251 Page 9 of 10

252 photograph of the sexual offender within 60 days before the 253 sexual offender's release and provide this photograph to the 254 Department of Corrections and also place it in the sexual offender's file. If the sexual offender is in the custody of a 255 256 local jail, the custodian of the local jail shall register the 257 offender within 3 business days after intake of the offender for 258 any reason and upon release, and shall notify the Department of 259 Law Enforcement of the sexual offender's release and provide to 260 the Department of Law Enforcement the information specified in this paragraph and any information specified in subparagraph 2. 261 262 that the Department of Law Enforcement requests.

263 2. The department may provide any other information deemed
264 necessary, including criminal and corrections records,
265 nonprivileged personnel and treatment records, when available.

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Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
