### **SUMMARY ANALYSIS**

The Division of Hotels and Restaurants (division) within the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) is charged with protecting the public health, safety, and welfare by enforcing the provisions of ch. 509, F.S., and other laws relating to the inspection and regulation of public lodging establishments and public food service establishments.

Included in these responsibilities is the requirement to provide technical assistance to the Florida Building Commission and the State Fire Marshal when construction standards are being updated and to enforce the Florida Building Code and Florida Fire Prevention Code when conducting inspections of public lodging and public food service establishments.

The bill eliminates the responsibilities of the division to work with the Florida Building Commission and the State Fire Marshal in updating and enforcing the Florida Building Code and Florida Fire Prevention Code.

This legislation will allow for a reduction in staff and related expenses of up to 3 Full Time Equivalent positions and \$250,000 from Hotel and Restaurant Trust Fund.

The effective date of the bill is July 1, 2008

### I. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS

### A. HOUSE PRINCIPLES ANALYSIS:

Provide limited government: The bill eliminates the Division of Hotels and Restaurant's roles of assisting with the development of construction standards and enforcing the Florida Building Code and Florida Fire Prevention Code during inspections.

### B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

# Present Situation

Currently, the division is charged with assisting with assisting the Florida Building Commission and State Fire Marshal with updating the Florida Building Code (building code) and Florida Fire Prevention Code (fire code), as they pertain to public food and lodging establishments, and enforcing the building and fire codes during inspections of public food and lodging establishments.

### **Effect of Proposed Changes**

The bill removes the requirements for the division to provide assistance to the Florida Building Commission and the State Fire Marshal in updating and enforcing the building and fire codes.

### C. SECTION DIRECTORY:

Section 1. Amends s. 509.032, F.S., removing the division's involvement with the Florida Building Commission and State Fire Marshal in the development of new standards and the enforcement of the Florida Building Code and Florida Fire Prevention Code.

Section 2. Provides an effective date of July 1, 2008.
