21	used solely to attract and support major sports events in this

26	League, the men's and women's National Collegiate Athletic

and promote major sporting events, and the uses must be approvedby the Florida Sports Foundation.

The remaining proceeds of the Florida Professional 31 2. Sports Team license plate must be allocated to the Florida 32 Sports Foundation, a direct-support organization of the Office 33 of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. These funds must be 34 35 deposited into the Professional Sports Development Trust Fund within the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. 36 37 These funds must be used by the Florida Sports Foundation to promote the economic development of the sports industry; to 38 distribute licensing and royalty fees to participating 39 professional sports teams; to promote education programs in 40 Florida schools that provide an awareness of the benefits of 41 physical activity and nutrition standards; to partner with the 42 43 Department of Education and the Department of Health to develop 44 a program that recognizes schools whose students demonstrate excellent physical fitness or fitness improvement; to institute 45 a grant program for communities bidding on minor sporting events 46 47 that create an economic impact for the state; to distribute funds to Florida-based charities designated by the Florida 48 49 Sports Foundation and the participating professional sports 50 teams; and to fulfill the sports promotion responsibilities of the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. 51

The Florida Sports Foundation shall provide an annual financial audit in accordance with s. 215.981 of its financial accounts and records by an independent certified public accountant pursuant to the contract established by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development as specified in s.
