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13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

15	Section 1. Subsections (4) and (8) of section 320.131,
16	Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (9) is added to
17	that section, to read:
18	320.131 Temporary tags
19	(4) (a) Temporary tags shall be conspicuously displayed in
20	the rear license plate bracket or <u>,</u> attached to the inside of the
21	rear window in an upright position so as to be clearly visible
22	from the rear of the vehicle. on vehicles requiring front display
23	of license plates, temporary tags shall be displayed on the front
24	of the vehicle in the location where the metal license plate
25	would normally be displayed.
26	(b) The department shall designate specifications for the
27	media upon which the temporary tag is printed. Such media shall
28	be either nonpermeable or subject to weatherproofing so that it
29	maintains its structural integrity, including graphic and data

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30 <u>adhesion, in all weather conditions after being placed on a</u> 31 <u>vehicle.</u>

32 (8) The department shall may administer an electronic 33 system for licensed motor vehicle dealers to use for in issuing 34 temporary tags license plates. Upon issuing a temporary license 35 plate, the dealer shall access the electronic system and enter 36 the appropriate vehicle and owner information within the 37 timeframe specified by department rule. If a dealer fails to 38 comply with the department's requirements for issuing temporary 39 tags license plates using the electronic system, the department may deny, suspend, or revoke a license under s. 320.27(9)(b)16. 40 41 upon proof that the licensee has failed to comply with the 42 department's requirements. The department may adopt rules to 43 administer this section.

44 (9) (a) The department shall implement a secure print-on-45 demand electronic temporary tag registration, record retention, 46 and issue system required for use by every department-authorized 47 issuer of temporary tags by the end of the 2007-2008 fiscal year. 48 Such system shall enable the department to issue, on demand, a 49 temporary tag number in response to a request from the issuer by 50 way of a secure electronic exchange of data and enable the issuer 51 to print the temporary tag that has all required information. A 52 motor vehicle dealer licensed under this chapter may charge a fee 53 to comply with this subsection.

54 (b) To ensure the continuation of operations for issuers if
55 a system outage occurs, the department shall allow the limited
56 use of a backup manual issuance method during an outage which
57 requires recordkeeping of information as determined by the
58 department and requires the timely electronic reporting of this

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59	information to the department.
60	(c) The department may adopt rules necessary to administer
61	this subsection. Such rules may include exemptions from the
62	requirements of this subsection as required to administer the
63	program, as well as exemptions for issuers who do not require a
64	dealer license under this chapter because of the type or size of
65	vehicle being sold.
66	Section 2. Section 320.96, Florida Statutes, is repealed.
67	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
