The Florida Insurance Council is encouraged to 80 recommend a list of candidates for consideration. 81 (t) One member who is a representative of public education. 82 One member who is a swimming pool contractor licensed (u) 83 to do business in this state and actively engaged in the 84 profession. The Florida Swimming Pool Association and the United 85 Pool and Spa Association are encouraged to recommend a list of 86 candidates for consideration who shall be the chair. 87 88 The Governor shall designate one of the 23 members to serve as 89 the chair of the commission who shall serve as the chair at the 90 pleasure of the Governor. Any person serving on the commission under paragraph (c) or paragraph (h) on October 1, 2003, and who 91 92 has served less than two full terms is eligible for reappointment 93 to the commission regardless of whether he or she meets the new 94 qualification. (2) All appointments shall be for terms of 4 years, except 95 96 that of the chair who shall serve at the pleasure of the

97 Governor. Each person who is a member of the Board of Building Codes and Standards on the effective date of this act shall serve 98 the remainder of their term as a member of the Florida Building 99 100 Commission. Except for the chair, newly created positions on the 101 Florida Building Commission shall be appointed after February 1, 102 1999. A vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the 103 unexpired term. Any member who shall, during his or her term, 104 cease to meet the qualifications for original appointment, through ceasing to be a practicing member of the profession 105

108 Section 5. Section 553.75, Florida Statutes, is amended to 109 read:

110 553.75 Organization of commission; rules and regulations; 111 meetings; staff; fiscal affairs; public comment.--


(1) The commission shall meet on call of the secretary. The commission shall annually elect from its appointive members such officers as it may choose.

(2) The commission shall meet at the call of its chair, at the request of a majority of its membership, at the request of the department, or at such times as may be prescribed by its rules. The members shall be notified in writing of the time and place of a regular or special meeting at least 7 days in advance of the meeting. A majority of members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.

122 The department shall be responsible for the provision (3) 123 of administrative and staff support services relating to the 124 functions of the commission. With respect to matters within the jurisdiction of the commission, the department shall be 125 126 responsible for the implementation and faithful discharge of all 127 decisions of the commission made pursuant to its authority under 128 the provisions of this part. The department is specifically 129 authorized to use communications media technology in conducting 130 meetings of the commission or any meetings held in conjunction 131 with meetings of the commission.

(4) Meetings of the commission shall be conducted so as to
 encourage participation by interested persons in attendance. At a
 minimum, the commission shall provide one opportunity for
 interested members of the public in attendance at a meeting to
