(8) ACTIONS FOR DAMAGES.--

(a) A homeowner may bring an action against a foreclosurerescue consultant or equity purchaser for any violation of this
section. Judgment must be entered for actual damages and
consequential damages, reasonable attorney's fees and costs, and
appropriate equitable relief, including, but not limited to, the
rescission of any deed, mortgage, or other instrument signed by
the homeowner or equity purchaser. The rights and remedies
provided in this section are cumulative with, and not a
limitation of, any other rights and remedies provided by law.

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Any action brought pursuant to this subsection must be commenced within 4 years after the date of the alleged violation.

- (b) In addition to any other damages available to a homeowner:
- 1. The court may award damages up to one and one-half times the compensation charged by the foreclosure-rescue consultant if the court finds that the foreclosure-rescue consultant's conduct was in bad faith.
- 2. For a violation of paragraph (5)(c), paragraph (5)(d), paragraph (5)(e), or paragraph (5)(f), the court may award damages no less than one and one-half times the actual damages.
- (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection, no action may be brought on the basis of a violation of this section except by a homeowner against whom the violation was committed or by the attorney general.
