17	recommendations for vacancies on the Public Service
18	Commission to the Governor; requiring the council to
19	nominate a minimum of three persons for each vacancy;
20	revising the date that recommendations for vacancies must
21	be submitted; providing for the council to fill a vacancy
22	on the commission if the Governor fails to do so;
23	authorizing the Governor to recall an appointee; amending
24	ss. 350.061 and 350.0614, F.S., relating to the
25	appointment, oversight, and compensation of the Public
26	Counsel; conforming provisions to changes made by the act;

30 31 Section 1. Section 350.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to 32 read:

33 350.012 Committee on Public <u>Counsel</u> Service Commission 34 Oversight; creation; membership; powers and duties.--

35 (1)There is created a standing joint committee of the Legislature, designated the Committee on Public Counsel Service 36 37 Commission Oversight, and composed of 12 members appointed as 38 follows: six members of the Senate appointed by the President of 39 the Senate, two of whom must be members of the minority party; 40 and six members of the House of Representatives appointed by the 41 Speaker of the House of Representatives, two of whom must be 42 members of the minority party. The terms of members shall be for 43 2 years and shall run from the organization of one Legislature to 44 the organization of the next Legislature. The President shall 45 appoint the chair of the committee in even-numbered years and the 46 vice chair in odd-numbered years, and the Speaker of the House of 47 Representatives shall appoint the chair of the committee in odd-48 numbered years and the vice chair in even-numbered years, from 49 among the committee membership. Vacancies shall be filled in the 50 same manner as the original appointment. Members shall serve 51 without additional compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 52 expenses.

(2) The committee shall:

(a) Recommend to the Governor nominees to fill a vacancy on the Public Service Commission, as provided by general law; and (b) appoint a Public Counsel as provided by general law.

(3) (4) The committee will not have a permanent staff, but 61 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 62 63 Representatives shall select staff members from among existing 64 legislative staff, when and as needed. 65 Section 2. Subsections (1), (5), (6), (7), and (8) of 66 section 350.031, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 67 350.031 Florida Public Service Commission Nominating Council.--68 There is created a Florida Public Service Commission 69 (1)70 Nominating Council consisting of 12 nine members. At least one 71 member of the council must be 60 years of age or older. Six Three 72 members, including three members one member of the House of 73 Representatives, one of whom must be a member of the minority 74 party, shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the 75 Speaker of the House of Representatives. Six; three members, 76 including three members one member of the Senate, one of whom 77 must be a member of the minority party, shall be appointed by and 78 serve at the pleasure of the President of the Senate; and three 79 members shall be selected and appointed by a majority vote of the 80 other six members of the council. All terms shall be for 4 years 81 except those members of the House and Senate, who shall serve 2-82 year terms concurrent with the 2-year elected terms of House 83 members. The President of the Senate shall appoint the chair of 84 the council in even-numbered years and the vice chair in odd-85 numbered years, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives 86 shall appoint the chair of the council in odd-numbered years and 87 the vice chair in even-numbered years, from among the council

88 <u>membership.</u> Vacancies on the council shall be filled for the 89 unexpired portion of the term in the same manner as original 90 appointments to the council. A member may not be reappointed to 91 the council, except for a member of the House of Representatives 92 or the Senate who may be appointed to two 2-year terms or a 93 person who is appointed to fill the remaining portion of an 94 unexpired term.

95 (5) A person may not be nominated to the Governor Committee 96 on Public Service Commission Oversight until the council has 97 determined that the person is competent and knowledgeable in one or more fields, which shall include, but not be limited to: 98 public affairs, law, economics, accounting, engineering, finance, 99 100 natural resource conservation, energy, or another field substantially related to the duties and functions of the 101 102 commission. The commission shall fairly represent the above-103 stated fields. Recommendations of the council shall be 104 nonpartisan.

105 It is the responsibility of the council to nominate to (6) 106 the Governor no fewer than three Committee on Public Service 107 Commission Oversight six persons for each vacancy occurring on the Public Service Commission. The council shall submit the 108 recommendations to the Governor committee by September 15 August 109 110 1 of those years in which the terms are to begin the following 111 January, or within 60 days after a vacancy occurs for any reason 112 other than the expiration of the term.

(7) The Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight shall select from the list of nominees provided by the nominating council three nominees for recommendation to the Governor for appointment to the commission. The recommendations must be

provided to the Governor within 45 days after receipt of the list 117 118 of nominees. The Governor shall fill a vacancy occurring on the 119 Public Service Commission by appointment of one of the applicants nominated by the council committee only after a background 120 121 investigation of such applicant has been conducted by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. If the Governor has not made an 122 123 appointment within 30 consecutive calendar days after the receipt 124 of the recommendation, the council committee, by majority vote, 125 shall appoint, within 30 days after the expiration of the 126 Governor's time to make an appointment, one person from the 127 applicants previously nominated to the Governor to fill the 128 vacancy. The Governor or the Governor's successor may recall an 129 appointee.

(8) Each appointment to the Public Service Commission shall
be subject to confirmation by the Senate during the next regular
session after the vacancy occurs. If the Senate refuses to
confirm or <u>fails to consider</u> rejects the Governor's appointment,
the council shall initiate, in accordance with this section, the
nominating process within 30 days.

Section 3. Subsection (1) of section 350.061, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

138 350.061 Public Counsel; appointment; oath; restrictions on 139 Public Counsel and his or her employees.--

(1) The Committee on Public <u>Counsel</u> Service Commission
Oversight shall appoint a Public Counsel by majority vote of the
members of the committee to represent the general public of
Florida before the Florida Public Service Commission. The Public
Counsel shall be an attorney admitted to practice before the
Florida Supreme Court and shall serve at the pleasure of the

146 Committee on Public <u>Counsel</u> Service Commission Oversight, subject 147 to biennial reconfirmation by the committee. The Public Counsel 148 shall perform his or her duties independently. Vacancies in the 149 office shall be filled in the same manner as the original 150 appointment.

151 Section 4. Subsection (2) of section 350.0614, Florida152 Statutes, is amended to read:

350.0614 Public Counsel; compensation and expenses.--

154 The Legislature declares and determines that the Public (2) 155 Counsel is under the legislative branch of government within the 156 intention of the legislation as expressed in chapter 216, and no 157 power shall be in the Executive Office of the Governor or its 158 successor to release or withhold funds appropriated to it, but 159 the same shall be available for expenditure as provided by law 160 and the rules or decisions of the Committee on Public Counsel 161 Service Commission Oversight.
