1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to postsecondary distance learning; 3 establishing the Florida Distance Learning Task Force; providing for membership; requiring the task force to 4 submit a report containing certain recommendations to the 5 6 Governor, the Legislature, and certain entities by a 7 specified date; providing for future expiration; creating 8 s. 1004.09, F.S.; establishing the Florida Higher 9 Education Distance Learning Catalog; requiring that the Florida Distance Learning Consortium establish guidelines 10 and procedures and provide information on certain 11 requirements and information relating to distance learning 12 courses and degree programs; requiring that the catalog 13 include an Internet-based analytic tool that collects and 14 analyzes certain data; amending s. 1009.23, F.S.; 15 16 exempting a distance learning course from laboratory fees; 17 authorizing the State Board of Education to adopt rules; authorizing a community college to assess a student 18 19 enrolled in a course listed in the catalog a per-credit-20 hour user fee; requiring that such fee not exceed a certain amount; prohibiting the assessment of other fees 21 if the distance learning course user fee is assessed; 22 requiring that the board of trustees report to the 23 24 Division of Community Colleges the total amount of revenue 25 generated by such fee for the preceding year and how such 26 fee was expended; requiring that the link for the catalog be prominently displayed on the institution's website; 27 amending s. 1009.24, F.S.; authorizing a state university 28 Page 1 of 10

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37	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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39	Section 1. Florida Distance Learning Task Force
40	(1) The Florida Distance Learning Task Force is
41	established to make recommendations to facilitate access to
42	undergraduate distance learning resources that enable public
43	postsecondary educational institutions to fulfill their missions
44	while contributing to and sharing in the distance learning
45	resources of the Florida Distance Learning Consortium.
46	(2)(a) Members of the task force shall be appointed by the
47	chancellors of the Division of Community Colleges and the Board
48	of Governors and shall be comprised of nine members.
49	(b) The membership of the task force shall consist of:
50	1. Four members from the State University System, with one
51	member being a state university president, one member having
52	experience in academic affairs or student affairs, one member
53	having experience in finance or business services, and one
54	member being from the Chancellor's Office of the Board of
55	Governors and having experience in distance learning education.
56	2. Four members from the Community College System, with

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57 one member being a community college president, one member having experience in academic affairs or student affairs, one 58 member having experience in finance or business services, and 59 60 one member being from the Chancellor's Office of the Division of 61 Community Colleges and having experience in distance learning 62 education. 63 3. One member who is the executive director of the Florida Distance Learning Consortium. 64 65 (3) The task force shall submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 66 67 Representatives, the State Board of Education, the Board of Governors, and the university and community college boards of 68 trustees, no later than March 1, 2009, a detailed report that 69 70 includes, but is not limited to, recommendations regarding: (a) 71 The management and promotion of the Florida Higher 72 Education Distance Learning Catalog pursuant to s. 1004.09, 73 Florida Statutes, to help increase student access to undergraduate distance learning courses and degree programs and, 74 75 in particular, students seeking accelerated access in order to 76 complete their degrees. 77 The creation of a central content repository for (b) 78 instructional resources which can be used by faculty in 79 developing, evaluating, and enhancing distance learning courses 80 and degree programs. The potential use of distance learning as a means to 81 (C) 82 address critical educational needs of the state. The evaluation and promotion of new and proven 83 (d) 84 instructional methods, emerging technologies, and quality Page 3 of 10

85 distance learning courses and degree programs. The coordination and support of educational programs 86 (e) and other training opportunities for faculty and professional 87 staff in developing, evaluating, and enhancing distance learning 88 89 courses and degree programs. 90 A process for negotiating statewide licensing and (f) 91 pricing agreements for distance learning resources and entering 92 into agreements with distance learning resource providers when 93 such negotiations and agreements result in cost savings for the 94 participating institutions. Opportunities for building partnerships among 95 (g) 96 educational institutions, businesses, and communities. (h) Methods that will improve student access to and 97 98 completion of distance learning courses and degree programs. (i) Policies that address ways to increase access and 99 100 cost-effectiveness in the development and delivery of 101 undergraduate distance learning courses and degree programs. 102 Such recommended policies must address the cost variations that 103 exist within the delivery system and identify the best practices 104 that minimize costs of the development and delivery of distance 105 learning courses while enhancing the effectiveness of 106 instruction. 107 (j) An accountability mechanism to assess the 108 effectiveness of the services provided by the Florida Distance 109 Learning Consortium. (k) The future role of the Florida Distance Learning 110 Consortium as a facilitator of the state's public undergraduate 111 postsecondary distance learning. 112

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113 (1) A process for reporting on the data collected by the 114 Florida Higher Education Distance Learning Catalog. 115 The definition of a distance learning course. (m) (n) 116 A plan for developing and implementing an online 117 system that streamlines and automates the registration process for students who have been admitted to a public postsecondary 118 119 educational institution and who wish to enroll in a course 120 listed in the Florida Higher Education Distance Learning 121 Catalog. The task force shall identify and address the applicable administrative, programmatic, and technical issues 122 123 and protocols necessary to ensure the implementation of such a 124 system as an alternative to the standard registration process of 125 each institution which complies with the academic policies and 126 procedures of the institutions offering the course. At a minimum, the system must: 127 128 1. Allow a qualified student to register for any 129 undergraduate course listed in the catalog, including courses 130 offered by an institution that is not the student's degree-131 granting or home institution. 2. Allow for the expedited transfer of the distance 132 133 learning course credit awarded by the institution offering the 134 distance learning course to the student's degree-granting or 135 home institution upon the student's successful completion of the distance learning course. 136 3. Be accessible from the catalog. 137 4. 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141 student information. 142 (4) This section expires July 1, 2009. Section 2. Section 1004.09, Florida Statutes, is created 143 144 to read: 145 1004.09 Florida Higher Education Distance Learning 146 Cataloq.--147 The Florida Higher Education Distance Learning Catalog (1) is established as an interactive, Internet-based central point 148 of access to distance learning courses, degree programs, and 149 resources offered by public postsecondary educational 150 151 institutions and is intended to assist in the coordination and 152 collaboration of articulation and access pursuant to part II of 153 chapter 1007. 154 The Florida Distance Learning Consortium must (2) establish operational guidelines and procedures for the catalog, 155 156 which must include: 157 (a) Requiring participating institutions to provide clear, 158 complete, and timely information concerning requirements for the 159 distance learning course and degree program, the type of 160 required technology and technical equipment, any prerequisite 161 courses or technology competencies and skills, the availability 162 of academic support services, financial aid resources, and the 163 costs, fees, and payment information and policies. 164 (b) Requiring that distance learning courses and degree programs meet applicable and appropriate accreditation standards 165 166 and criteria. 172	(3) The catalog must include an Internet-based analytic
173	tool that allows for the collection and analysis of data,

179	listed in the catalog.

189	Section 3. Subsection (12) of section 1009.23, Florida
190	Statutes, is amended, present subsection (16) of that section is

194	(12) <u>(a)</u> In addition to tuition, out-of-state, financial
195	aid, capital improvement, student activity and service, and
196	technology fees authorized in this section, each community

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197 college board of trustees is authorized to establish fee 198 schedules for the following user fees and fines: laboratory fees, which do not apply to a distance learning course; parking 199 200 fees and fines; library fees and fines; fees and fines relating 201 to facilities and equipment use or damage; access or 202 identification card fees; duplicating, photocopying, binding, or 203 microfilming fees; standardized testing fees; diploma 204 replacement fees; transcript fees; application fees; graduation 205 fees; and late fees related to registration and payment. Such user fees and fines shall not exceed the cost of the services 206 207 provided and shall only be charged to persons receiving the service. A community college may not charge any fee except as 208 authorized by law or rules of the State Board of Education. 209 210 Parking fee revenues may be pledged by a community college board 211 of trustees as a dedicated revenue source for the repayment of 212 debt, including lease-purchase agreements and revenue bonds with terms not exceeding 20 years and not exceeding the useful life 213 214 of the asset being financed. Community colleges shall use the services of the Division of Bond Finance of the State Board of 215 Administration to issue any revenue bonds authorized by the 216 217 provisions of this subsection. Any such bonds issued by the 218 Division of Bond Finance shall be in compliance with the 219 provisions of the State Bond Act. Bonds issued pursuant to the State Bond Act shall be validated in the manner established in 220 chapter 75. 225 complaint is filed, and the complaint and order of the circuit court shall be served only on the state attorney of the circuit 226 227 in which the action is pending. 228 The State Board of Education may adopt rules pursuant (b) 229 to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer this subsection. 230 (16) (a) Each community college may assess a student who 231 enrolls in a course listed in the Florida Higher Education 232 Distance Learning Catalog established pursuant to s. 1004.09 a 233 per-credit-hour distance learning course user fee. 234 The amount of the distance learning course user fee (b) 235 may not exceed the additional costs of the services provided which are attributable to the development and delivery of the 236 distance learning course. If a community college assesses the 237 238 distance learning course user fee, the institution may not 239 assess any other fees to cover the additional costs. By 240 September 1 of each year, each board of trustees shall report to the Division of Community Colleges the total amount of revenue 241 242 generated by the distance learning course user fee for the prior 243 academic year and how the revenue was expended. 244 (C) The link for the catalog must be prominently displayed 245 on the institution's website to inform students of the catalog. 246 Section 4. Present subsection (17) of section 1009.24, 247 Florida Statutes, is redesignated as subsection (18), and a new subsection (17) is added to that section, to read: 248 1009.24 State university student fees.--249 (17) (a) A state university may assess a student who 250 enrolls in a course listed in the Florida Higher Education 251 252 Distance Learning Catalog established pursuant to s. 1004.09 a

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253 per-credit-hour distance learning course fee. 254 (b) The amount of the distance learning course fee may not 255 exceed the additional costs of the services provided which are 256 attributable to the development and delivery of the distance 257 learning course. If the distance learning course fee is assessed by a state university, the institution may not assess 258 duplicative fees to cover the additional costs. 259 260 (c) The link for the catalog must be prominently displayed on the institution's website informing students of the catalog. 261 262 Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
