33 licensed under the laws of this state is convicted of insurance 34 fraud involving a claim for personal injury protection benefits 35 as required by s. 627.736, the appropriate board, or the 36 Department of Health if there is no board, shall, in addition to 37 any other punishment less than revocation or relinquishment of 38 the license, suspend the license of such health care practitioner 39 for 12 months.

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
