The Committee on Judiciary (Baker) recommended the following amendment:

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Section 37. Effective July 1, 2008, section 16.62, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 16.62 Coordinating Council on Gang-Reduction Strategies. -
- (1) CREATION.—A coordinating council, as defined in s. 20.03, named the Coordinating Council on Gang-Reduction
- Strategies, is established within the Department of Legal
- Affairs. The council is subject to the provisions of s. 20.052.
- (2) PURPOSE.—The purpose of the council is to develop and implement a statewide strategy for reducing criminal street

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gangs and gang-related crime and violence, and to coordinate and give direction, guidance, and support to the efforts of federal, state, and local government agencies, law enforcement, at-risk youth prevention and intervention organizations, elected officials, and community leaders to combat gangs in this state. All recommendations of the council are subject to approval by a majority of the members of the council.

- (3) COMPOSITION.—
- (a) The council shall consist of the following eleven members:
- 1. The Attorney General or his or her designee, who shall serve as chair of the council;
- 2. The Commissioner of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement or his or her designee;
- 3. The Secretary of the Department of Education or his or her designee;
- 4. The Secretary of the Department of Children and Families or his or her designee;
- 5. The Secretary of the Department of Corrections or his or her designee;
- 6. The Secretary of the Department of Juvenile Justice or his or her designee;
- 7. The Director of the Office of Drug Control or his or her designee;
- 8. The Director of the Florida Highway Patrol or his or her designee;
- 9. The President of the Florida Sheriffs Association or his or her designee;

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- 10. The President of the Florida Police Chiefs Association or his or her designee; and
- 11. The President of the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association or his or her designee.
- (b) Council members shall serve without compensation. Members are entitled to per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. State officers and employees shall be reimbursed from the budget of the agency through which they serve. Other members may be reimbursed by the Department of Legal Affairs.
 - (4) MEETINGS; PROCEDURES; RECORDS.—
 - (a) The council shall meet at the call of the chair.
- (b) The business of the council shall be presented to the council in the form of an agenda. The agenda shall be set by the chair and shall include items of business requested by the council members.
- (c) A majority of the members constitutes a quorum, and action by a majority of a quorum shall be official.
- (d) The minutes for each meeting shall be submitted to the chair within 14 days after each meeting.
 - (5) POWERS AND DUTIES. -
 - (a) The council shall:
- 1. Gather, compile, assimilate, and facilitate the distribution to government agencies and community organizations of data on criminal street gangs and at-risk youth prevention and intervention programs in Florida.
- 2. Develop and implement a statewide strategy to stop the growth of, reduce the number of, and render ineffectual criminal street gangs in Florida.

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- 3. Coordinate and give guidance, direction, and support to efforts by federal, state, and local government agencies, law enforcement, at-risk youth prevention and intervention organizations, elected officials, and community leaders to combat gangs and reduce gang-related crime and violence in this state, including the formation of regional task forces and local and regional coalitions whose membership and direction the council may determine.
 - (b) The council may:
- 1. Coordinate with any state agency, any political subdivision, or any school district of the state in the furtherance of its mission.
- 2. Request from any department, division, board, bureau, commission, or other agency of the state, or of any political subdivision thereof, cooperation and assistance in the performance of its duties.
- (6) EXPIRATION.—The council shall expire on December 31, 2009, unless reenacted by the Legislature.

Section 38. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, and except for this section, which shall take effect July 1, 2008, this act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
