Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (15) of 18 19 section 121.021, Florida Statutes, to read: Definitions.--The following words and phrases as 20 121.021 used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 21 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 22 (15)23 Effective October 1, 2008, "special risk member" 24 (f) includes any member who is employed by the state and meets the 25 26 special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(i). 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121.0515 Special risk membership.--

30 (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special
 31 risk member, must meet the following criteria:

(a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement 32 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 33 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected 34 35 police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties 36 37 and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the 38 member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose 39 primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal 40 of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or 41 42 command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support 43 44 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, 45 legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 46

47 (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 48 49 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of a 50 local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties 51 and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of 52 fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct 53 supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or 54 firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance 55 performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division 56 Page 2 of 8

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57 of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer 58 Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command 59 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; 60 provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 61 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 62 63 personnel, shall not be included and further provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter 64 65 training, or as the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities, and for which the 66 67 employer paid the special risk contribution rate, shall be included; 68

The member must be employed as a correctional officer 69 (C) 70 and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and 71 72 responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, 73 74 or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail 75 outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members 76 77 who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, 78 79 those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 80 included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by 81 82 rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;

(d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life
Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an

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85 emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in 86 compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary 87 duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical 88 89 technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have such 90 91 responsibility. However, administrative support personnel, 92 including, but not limited to, those whose primary 93 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 94 personnel, shall not be included;

95 The member must be employed as a community-based (e) correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to 96 be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the 97 98 member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 99 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and 100 counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within the community; or the member must 101 be the supervisor of a member or members who have such 102 103 responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 104 105 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal services, 106 and personnel management, shall not be included; however, 107 probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators 108 shall participate in the Special Risk Class;

(f) The member must be employed in one of the following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or her time performing duties which involve contact with patients or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or institution:

145 The member must be employed as a youth custody officer (q) and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance 146 147 with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, 148 149 control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, and counseling of 150 assigned juveniles within the community; or

151 (h) The member must be employed by a law enforcement agency or medical examiner's office in a forensic discipline 152 recognized by the International Association for Identification 153 154 and must qualify for active membership in the International Association for Identification. The member's primary duties and 155 156 responsibilities must include the collection, examination, 157 preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of 158 physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be 159 the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or command 160 officer of one or more individuals with such responsibility. 161 Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, 162 those whose primary responsibilities are clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 163 included; or 164

The member must be employed by the state in a position 165 (i) that requires at least 75 percent of his or her time to be spent 166 performing duties that involve contact with residents, patients, 167 or inmates in a correctional, juvenile justice, developmental 168

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169 disability, or forensic facility or institution. Administrative 170 support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose 171 primary duties and responsibilities are clerical or in 172 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 173 included.

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(3) PROCEDURE FOR DESIGNATING. --

175 (a) Any member of the Florida Retirement System employed by the state or a county, city, or special district who feels 176 177 that he or she meets the criteria set forth in this section for 178 membership in the Special Risk Class may request that his or her 179 employer submit an application to the department requesting that the department designate him or her as a special risk member. If 180 the employer agrees that the member meets the requirements for 181 182 special risk membership, the employer shall submit an 183 application to the department in behalf of the employee 184 containing a certification that the member meets the criteria 185 for special risk membership set forth in this section and such 186 other supporting documentation as may be required by 187 administrative rule. The department shall, within 90 days, either designate or refuse to designate the member as a special 188 189 risk member. If the employer declines to submit the member's 190 application to the department or if the department does not 191 designate the member as a special risk member, the member or the 192 employer may appeal to the State Retirement Commission, as provided in s. 121.23, for designation as a special risk member. 193 A member who receives a final affirmative ruling pursuant to 194 such appeal for special risk membership shall have special risk 195 membership retroactive to the date such member would have had 196 Page 7 of 8

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197 special risk membership had such membership been approved by the employer and the department, as determined by the department, 198 and the employer contributions shall be paid in full within 1 199 200 year after such final ruling.

201 Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 202 203 of the state and its political subdivisions and the dependents, 204 survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees are 205 extended the basic protections afforded by governmental 206 retirement systems. These persons must be provided benefits that 207 are fair and adequate and that are managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner as required by Section 14, 208 209 Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, 210 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature hereby determines and declares that this act fulfills an important state interest. 211 Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2008.

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
