A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Juneteenth Independence Day; amending s. 683.21, F.S.; renaming Juneteenth Day as "Juneteenth

Independence Day"; requiring the Governor to annually issue a proclamation concerning Juneteenth Independence Day; providing criteria concerning the petition's

contents; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 683.21, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

683.21 Juneteenth Independence Day. --

- June 19th of each year is hereby designated "Juneteenth Independence Day" to commemorate the traditional observance of the day the slaves in Florida were notified of the Emancipation Proclamation and in recognition of June 19, 1865, when Union General Gordon Granger announced freedom for all slaves in the southwestern United States.
- The Governor shall annually may issue annually a proclamation designating June 19th as Juneteenth Independence Day, to be observed on the Saturday that is closest to June 19th, recognizing the end of slavery in the United States and the significant contributions that individuals of African descent have made to this state and the United States, and calling on public officials, schools, private organizations, and all members of the public citizens to honor the historic significance of the day and observe the day in an appropriate manner.
