SUMMARY ANALYSIS

Currently, Hillsborough County is authorized to waive payment and performance bond requirements on projects to encourage local small businesses to participate in county procurement programs. A small business that has been the successful bidder on three projects where the bond has been waived is ineligible to bid on additional projects where the bond has been waived and that cost not less than \$200,000 and not exceeding \$500,000. The bill increases the number of projects from three to five. The bill also extends the expiration of the act from September 30, 2009 to September 30, 2011.

FULL ANALYSIS

I. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS

A. HOUSE PRINCIPLES ANALYSIS:

This bill does not appear to implicate any House Principles.

B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

Current Situation

Chapter 2004-414, L.O.F., authorizes Hillsborough County to waive payment and performance bond requirements for construction or repair projects that cost \$500,000 or less and are awarded pursuant to an economic development program that encourages small businesses to participate in county procurement programs. Currently, a small business that has been the successful bidder on three projects where the bond has been waived is ineligible to bid on additional projects where the bond has been waived is stan \$200,000 and not exceeding \$500,000. The act expires September 30, 2009.

Effect of Proposed Changes

As stated above, a small business that has been the successful bidder on three projects where the bond has been waived is ineligible to bid on additional projects where the bond has been waived and that cost not less than \$200,000 and not exceeding \$500,000. The bill increases the number of projects from three to five. The bill also extends the expiration of the act from September 30, 2009 to September 30, 2011.

 - Section 2: Provides an effective date of upon becoming law.

Under current law, for those contracts for which a payment and performance bond has been waived, the county is required to pay all persons defined in section 713.01, F.S., who furnish labor, services, or materials, to the same extent and upon the same conditions that a surety on the payment bond would have been obligated to pay. The bill may increase the county's liability for payment for a single contractor when that contractor has more contracts for which a bond has been waived.
