An act relating to pedestrian safety; amending ss. 316.075 and 316.130, F.S.; requiring a driver to stop at certain intersections to allow a pedestrian to cross a roadway when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk; amending s. 318.18, F.S.; providing penalties; directing that fines received be used by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to educate the public about pedestrian safety and traffic laws governing crosswalks; amending s. 318.21, F.S.; providing for distribution of fines; providing an effective date.

Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section Section 1. 316.075, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.075 Traffic control signal devices.--

- Except for automatic warning signal lights installed or to be installed at railroad crossings, whenever traffic, including municipal traffic, is controlled by traffic control signals exhibiting different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows, successively one at a time or in combination, only the colors green, red, and yellow shall be used, except for special pedestrian signals carrying a word legend, and the lights shall indicate and apply to drivers of vehicles and pedestrians as follows:
 - (C) Steady red indication. --
 - Vehicular traffic facing a steady red signal shall stop

before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or, if none, then before entering the intersection and shall remain standing until a green indication is shown; however:

- a. The driver of a vehicle which is stopped at a clearly marked stop line, but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection, or, if none then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering the intersection in obedience to a steady red signal may make a right turn, but shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and other traffic proceeding as directed by the signal at the intersection, except that municipal and county authorities may prohibit any such right turn against a steady red signal at any intersection, which prohibition shall be effective when a sign giving notice thereof is erected in a location visible to traffic approaching the intersection.
- b. The driver of a vehicle on a one-way street that intersects another one-way street on which traffic moves to the left shall stop in obedience to a steady red signal, but may then make a left turn into the one-way street, but shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and other traffic proceeding as directed by the signal at the intersection, except that municipal and county authorities may prohibit any such left turn as described, which prohibition shall be effective when a sign giving notice thereof is attached to the traffic control signal device at the intersection.
 - 2.a. The driver of a vehicle facing a steady red signal

shall stop before entering the crosswalk and remain stopped to allow a pedestrian, with a permitted signal, to cross a roadway when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk and is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling.

- \underline{b} . Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal as provided in s. 316.0755, pedestrians facing a steady red signal shall not enter the roadway.
- (4) A violation of this section is a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable pursuant to chapter 318 as either a pedestrian violation or, if the infraction resulted from the operation of a vehicle, as a moving violation.
- Section 2. Subsection (7) of section 316.130, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 316.130 <u>Pedestrians;</u> Pedestrian obedience to traffic control devices and traffic regulations.--
- (7) (a) The driver of a vehicle at an intersection with a traffic control signal in place shall stop before entering the crosswalk and remain stopped to allow a pedestrian, with a permitted signal, to cross a roadway when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk and is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling.
- (b) The driver of a vehicle at any crosswalk where signage so indicates shall stop and remain stopped to allow a pedestrian to cross a roadway when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk and is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling.
- (c) When traffic control signals are not in place or in operation and there is no signage indicating otherwise, the

driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way, slowing down or stopping if need be to so yield, to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in danger. Any pedestrian crossing a roadway at a point where a pedestrian tunnel or overhead pedestrian crossing has been provided shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.

- (19) A violation of this section is a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable pursuant to chapter 318 as either a pedestrian violation or, if the infraction resulted from the operation of a vehicle, as a moving violation.
- Section 3. Paragraph (i) is added to subsection (3) of section 318.18, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 318.18 Amount of penalties.--The penalties required for a noncriminal disposition pursuant to s. 318.14 or a criminal offense listed in s. 318.17 are as follows:

(3)

(i) A person cited under s. 316.075(1)(c) or s. 316.130(7) for failure to yield to a pedestrian or for failure to allow a pedestrian to cross at the crosswalk shall pay \$60 in addition to the amount listed in paragraph (a). The additional \$60 shall be distributed to the department to be used to educate the public about pedestrian safety and traffic laws governing crosswalks in this state.

Section 4. Subsection (18) is added to section 318.21, Florida Statutes, to read:
