The bill expresses the Legislature's intent to revise laws relating to the Department of Health.

This bill creates one undesignated section of law.

Section 20.43, F.S., creates the Department of Health, specifies the purposes of the department, outlines the organizational structure of the department, and requires the department to plan and administer its public health programs through its county health departments. The State Surgeon General and State Health Officer is the head of the department. Chapter 381, F.S., contains general provisions relating to public health, as administered by the Department of Health. Section 381.0011, F.S., establishes the duties and powers of the Department of Health.

## III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill expresses the Legislature's intent to revise laws relating to the Department of Health.

The effective date of the law is upon becoming a law.
