HR 9181 2008 1 House Resolution 2 A resolution recognizing November 2008 as "Lung Cancer Awareness Month." 3 4 5 WHEREAS, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death 6 in the State of Florida, and 7 WHEREAS, nearly 12,490 Floridians will die from lung cancer 8 in 2008 and more than 17,360 Floridians will be diagnosed with 9 the disease, and 10 WHEREAS, cigarette smoking and other tobacco use is the leading cause of lung cancer, with more than 87 percent of all 11 12 lung cancer attributed to smoking tobacco products, and 13 WHEREAS, early detection of lung cancer is very difficult, 14 costly, and has not yet been proven to improve survival rates, 15 and 16 WHEREAS, the 5-year survival rate for lung cancer is only 17 15 percent, and WHEREAS, smoking-related diseases, such as lung cancer, 18 19 cost Florida nearly \$6.32 billion in directly related health costs and another \$6.47 billion in smoking-caused productivity 20 21 losses, and 22 WHEREAS, the best known way to prevent lung cancer, the 23 premature deaths associated with lung cancer, and the costs related to this disease is to prevent youth from starting to use 24 tobacco and helping current smokers to quit, and 25 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society, in partnership with 26 the Florida Department of Health, helps adult and youth smokers 27

28 to stop smoking through the proven cessation support of the 29 toll-free Quit-For-Life-Line, 1-877-U-CAN-NOW, and WHEREAS, the Florida Division of the American Cancer 30 Society is committed to preventing youth use of and addiction to 31 tobacco through all scientifically proven methods, including the 32 measures detailed in the Centers for Disease Control and 33 34 Prevention's recommendations for a fully comprehensive statewide youth tobacco-use prevention and cessation program, NOW, 35 THEREFORE, 36 37 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of 38 39 Florida: 40 41 That the House of Representatives recognizes the month of November 2008 as "Lung Cancer Awareness Month" in Florida and 42 43 urges all Floridians to understand the risks associated with lung cancer, to take preventive steps to minimize those risks, 44 45 and to join the American Cancer Society in promoting better 46 health and lung-cancer prevention through the cessation of

47 current smoking and prevention of future tobacco use.
