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57 (1)A personal representative is a fiduciary who shall 58 observe the standards of care applicable to trustees as described by part VII of chapter 736. A personal representative 59 is under a duty to settle and distribute the estate of the 60 decedent in accordance with the terms of the decedent's will and 61 62 this code as expeditiously and efficiently as is consistent with 63 the best interests of the estate. A personal representative shall use the authority conferred by this code, the authority in 64 65 the will, if any, and the authority of any order of the court, for the best interests of interested persons, including 66 creditors. 67
