85 The task force shall submit a report and (7) recommendations to the Governor, the Chief Financial Officer, 86 87 the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 2009. The report must include any 88 89 specific recommendations for legislative action during the 2009 90 Regular Session of the Legislature. The task force is dissolved upon the submission of its 91 (8) 92 report. 93 Section 2. For the 2008-2009 fiscal year only, the sum of \$75,000 in nonrecurring general revenue is appropriated to the 94 University of South Florida to pay the per diem and travel 95 96 expenses of members of the Florida Public Task Force on Workplace Safety and to pay for the staff support specified in 97 98 this act. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. 99

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
