14	Section 1. Health Care Transition Services Task Force for
15	Youth and Young Adults with Disabilities
16	(1) The Department of Health shall create a statewide
17	Health Care Transition Services Task Force for Youth and Young
18	Adults with Disabilities. It is the intent of the Legislature
19	that the task force assess the need for health care transition
20	services for youth with disabilities, develop strategies to
21	ensure successful transition from the pediatric to the adult
22	health care system, and identify existing and potential funding
23	sources. The task force shall be composed of 14 members and shall
24	have representatives from at least three geographic areas in the
25	state, representing rural, suburban, and urban areas.
26	(2) The task force shall be composed of the following
27	persons:
28	(a) The Deputy Secretary of Children's Medical Services
29	within the Department of Health or his or her designee who shall
