Each 911 emergency dispatcher certificate expires 71 (d) 72 automatically if not renewed at the end of the 2-year period and 73 may be renewed if the holder meets the qualifications for 74 renewal as established by the department. A certificate that is 75 not renewed at the end of the 2-year period automatically 76 reverts to an inactive status for a period that may not exceed 77 180 days. Such certificate may be reactivated and renewed within 78 the 180-day period if the certificateholder meets all other qualifications for renewal and pays a \$50 late fee. Reactivation 79 80 shall be in a manner and on forms prescribed by department rule. (e) The department may suspend or revoke a certificate at 81 any time if it determines that the certificateholder does not 82 83 meet the applicable qualifications. 84 (f) A certificateholder may request that his or her 911

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85 emergency dispatcher certificate be placed on inactive status by 86 applying to the department before his or her current certification expires and paying a fee set by the department 87 88 which may not exceed \$100. 89 1. A certificateholder whose certificate has been on 90 inactive status for 1 year or less may renew his or her 91 certificate pursuant to the rules adopted by the department and 92 upon payment of a renewal fee set by the department which may not exceed \$100. 93 2. A certificateholder whose certificate has been on 94 inactive status for more than 1 year may renew his or her 95 96 certificate pursuant to rules adopted by the department. 97 3.
