2 An act implementing the 2009-2010 General 3 Appropriations Act; providing legislative intent; 4 amending s. 253.034, F.S.; delaying the expiration of provisions authorizing the deposit of funds from the sale of property located in Palm Beach County by the 7 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund; amending s. 339.08, F.S.; delaying the expiration of provisions relating to the use of funds from the State Transportation Trust Fund; amending s. 339.135, F.S.; delaying the expiration of provisions relating to the transfer of funds from the Department of Transportation to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the purpose of funding the transportation-related needs of certain projects; revising the amount of such transfer; deleting obsolete provisions; providing for the effect of a veto of one or more specific appropriations or proviso provisions to which implementing language refers; providing for the continued operation of certain provisions notwithstanding a future repeal or expiration provided by the act; providing for severability; providing effective dates.

26 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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28 Section 1. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 29 implementing and administering provisions of this act apply to 30 the General Appropriations Act for the 2009-2010 fiscal year. Section 2. In order to implement section 11 of the 2009-31 32 2010 General Appropriations Act, subsection (13) of section 33 253.034, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 34 253.034 State-owned lands; uses.-35 (13) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, funds 36 from the sale of property by the Department of Highway Safety 37 and Motor Vehicles located in Palm Beach County are authorized 38 to be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund to 39 facilitate the exchange as provided in the General 40 Appropriations Act, provided that at the conclusion of both exchanges the values are equalized. This subsection expires July 41 42 1, 2010 2009. 43 Section 3. In order to implement section 10 of the 2009-2010 General Appropriations Act, paragraph (n) of subsection (1) 44 of section 339.08, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 45 339.08 Use of moneys in State Transportation Trust Fund.-46 47 (1) The department shall expend moneys in the State 48 Transportation Trust Fund accruing to the department, in 49 accordance with its annual budget. The use of such moneys shall 50 be restricted to the following purposes: 51 (n) To pay administrative expenses incurred in accordance 52 with applicable laws for a multicounty transportation or 53 expressway authority created under chapter 343 or chapter 348, 54 where jurisdiction for the authority includes a portion of the 55 State Highway System and the administrative expenses are in 56 furtherance of the duties and responsibilities of the authority



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57 in the development of improvements to the State Highway System.

Section 4. In order to implement Specific Appropriation
2042 of the 2009-2010 General Appropriations Act, subsection (5)
of section 339.135, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

339.135 Work program; legislative budget request;
definitions; preparation, adoption, execution, and amendment.(5)

65 (a) ADOPTION OF THE WORK PROGRAM.-The original approved 66 budget for operational and fixed capital expenditures for the 67 department shall be the Governor's budget recommendation and the 68 first year of the tentative work program, as both are amended by the General Appropriations Act and any other act containing 69 70 appropriations. In accordance with the appropriations act, the department shall, prior to the beginning of the fiscal year, 71 72 adopt a final work program which shall only include the original 73 approved budget for the department for the ensuing fiscal year together with any roll forwards approved pursuant to paragraph 74 75 (6) (c) and the portion of the tentative work program for the 76 following 4 fiscal years revised in accordance with the original 77 approved budget for the department for the ensuing fiscal year 78 together with said roll forwards. The adopted work program may 79 include only those projects submitted as part of the tentative 80 work program developed under the provisions of subsection (4) 81 plus any projects which are separately identified by specific 82 appropriation in the General Appropriations Act and any roll 83 forwards approved pursuant to paragraph (6)(c). However, any transportation project of the department which is identified by 84 85 specific appropriation in the General Appropriations Act shall

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be deducted from the funds annually distributed to the respective district pursuant to paragraph (4)(a). In addition, the department shall not in any year include any project or allocate funds to a program in the adopted work program that is contrary to existing law for that particular year. Projects shall not be undertaken unless they are listed in the adopted work program.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), and for the 2009-2010 93 94 2008-2009 fiscal year only, the Department of Transportation 95 shall transfer funds to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and 96 Economic Development in an amount equal to \$20 million 97 \$36,750,000 for the purpose of funding transportation-related needs of economic development projects, space and aerospace 98 99 infrastructure, and other economic development projects. This transfer shall not reduce, delete, or defer any existing 100 projects funded, as of July 1, 2009 2008, in the Department of 101 102 Transportation's 5-year work program. This paragraph expires July 1, <u>2010</u> 2009. 103

104 (c) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) or subparagraph (4) (a) 1., 105 and for the 2008-2009 fiscal year only, the Department of 106 Transportation shall fund projects in Specific Appropriations 107 2063, 2071, 2077, 2079, 2102, 2106, 2109, and 2116 of the 2008-2009 General Appropriations Act. Funding for these specific 108 109 appropriations shall be from projects or phases thereof within 110 the department's fiscal year 2008-2009 work program not 111 programmed for contract letting as identified with a work 112 program contract class code 8 and the box code RV. This funding shall not negatively impact safety, preservation, maintenance, 113 114 or project contingency levels as of July 1, 2008. This paragraph

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115 expires July 1, 2009.

116 Section 5. A section of this act which implements a specific appropriation or specifically identified proviso 117 118 language in the 2009-2010 General Appropriations Act is void if the specific appropriation or specifically identified proviso 119 120 language is vetoed. A section of this act which implements more than one specific appropriation or more than one portion of 121 122 specifically identified proviso language in the 2009-2010 General Appropriations Act is void if all the specific 123 124 appropriations or portions of specifically identified proviso 125 language are vetoed.

Section 6. <u>If any other act passed in 2009 contains a</u> <u>provision that is substantively the same as a provision in this</u> <u>act, but that removes or is otherwise not subject to the future</u> <u>repeal applied to such provision by this act, the Legislature</u> <u>intends that the provision in the other act shall take</u> <u>precedence and shall continue to operate, notwithstanding the</u> <u>future repeal provided by this act.</u>

Section 7. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are severable.

Section 8. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2009, or if this act fails to become a law until after that date, it shall take effect upon becoming a law and shall operate
