Senate Joint Resolution

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 1 of Article IX of the State Constitution to increase the number of students who may be assigned to a public school teacher and to require that the existing class size limits apply to the average number of students per teacher at a public school.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the following amendment to Section 1 of Article IX of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose:

ARTICLE IX EDUCATION

SECTION 1. Public education.-

- (a) The education of children is a fundamental value of the people of the State of Florida. It is, therefore, a paramount duty of the state to make adequate provision for the education of all children residing within its borders. Adequate provision shall be made by law for a uniform, efficient, safe, secure, and high quality system of free public schools that allows students to obtain a high quality education and for the establishment, maintenance, and operation of institutions of higher learning and other public education programs that the needs of the people may require.
 - (b) To assure that children attending public schools obtain

a high quality education, the legislature shall make adequate provision to ensure that, by the beginning of the 2010 school year, there are a sufficient number of classroom teachers to maintain small class sizes. classrooms so that:

- (1) The maximum number of students who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms For prekindergarten through grade 3, the number of students assigned to a teacher may not exceed 23 students; and the average number of students assigned to a teacher may does not exceed 18 students at a school.;
- (2) The maximum number of students who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms For grades 4 through 8, the number of students assigned to a teacher may not exceed 27; and the average number of students assigned to a teacher may does not exceed 22 students at a school.; and
- (3) The maximum number of students who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms For grades 9 through 12, the number of students assigned to a teacher may not exceed 30; and the average number of students assigned to a teacher may does not exceed 25 students at a school.

The class size requirements of this subsection do not apply to extracurricular or virtual classes. Payment of the costs associated with reducing class size to meet these requirements is the responsibility of the state and not of local school schools districts. Beginning with the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the legislature shall provide sufficient funds to reduce the average number of students in each classroom by at least two students per year until the maximum number of students per classroom does

not exceed the requirements of this subsection.

(c) (b) Every four-year old child in Florida shall be provided by the State a high quality pre-kindergarten learning opportunity in the form of an early childhood development and education program, which shall be voluntary, high quality, free, and delivered according to professionally accepted standards. An early childhood development and education program means an organized program designed to address and enhance each child's ability to make age appropriate progress in an appropriate range of settings in the development of language and cognitive capabilities and emotional, social, regulatory, and moral capacities through education in basic skills and such other skills as the Legislature may determine to be appropriate.

(c) The early childhood education and development programs provided by reason of subparagraph (b) shall be implemented no later than the beginning of the 2005 school year through funds generated in addition to those used for existing education, health, and development programs. Existing education, health, and development programs are those funded by the State as of January 1, 2002 that provided for child or adult education, health care, or development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following statement be placed on the ballot:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

ARTICLE IX, SECTION 1

SCHOOL AVERAGE CLASS SIZE.—This amendment to the State Constitution increases the number of students who may be assigned to a public school teacher. However, the average number of students per teacher may not exceed the current class size

limits.

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For prekindergarten through grade 3, a teacher may not have more than 23 students. However, the average number of students per teacher for this grade grouping at a school may not exceed 18 students.

For grade 4 through 8, a teacher may not have more than 27 students. However, the average number of students per teacher for this grade grouping at a school may not exceed 22 students.

For grade 9 through grade 12, a teacher may not be assigned more than 30 students. However, the average number of students per teacher at a school may not exceed 25 students.
