(2) As used in this section, the term "all-terrain 31 32 vehicle" means any motorized off-highway vehicle 60 50 inches or 33 less in width, having a dry weight of 1,500 900 pounds or less, designed to travel on three or more low-pressure tires, having a 34 35 seat designed to be straddled by the operator or a bench seat 36 and handlebars or a steering wheel for steering control, and 37 intended for use by a single operator or with additional riders 38 if the vehicle is designed for passengers with no passenger. For the purposes of this section, "all-terrain vehicle" also 39 includes any "two-rider ATV" as defined in s. 317.0003. 40
