Annual awards may be for up to 45 semester 18 19 credit hours or the equivalent. Before the registration period 20 each semester, the department shall transmit payment for each 21 award to the president or director of the postsecondary 22 education institution, or his or her representative, except that 23 the department may withhold payment if the receiving institution 24 fails to report or to make refunds to the department as required in this section. 25 26 (a) Within 30 days after the end of regular registration 27 each semester, the educational institution shall certify to the

department the eligibility status of each student who receives 28

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29 an award. 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was enrolled full time or earn a prorated number of credit hours
as determined by the Department of Education if the student was
enrolled less than full time for any part of the academic year.
If a student fails to earn the minimum number of hours required
to renew the scholarship, the student shall lose his or her
eligibility for renewal for a period equivalent to one academic
year. The student is eligible to restore the award the following
academic year if the student earns the hours for which the
student was enrolled at the level defined by the department and
meets the grade point average for renewal. A student is eligible
for such a restoration one time.
