Section 6. Section 499.029, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

499.029 Prescription Cancer Drug Donation Program.-

8 (1) This section may be cited as the "<u>Prescription</u> Cancer
 9 Drug Donation Program Act."

10 (2) There is created a <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug Donation 11 Program within the department for the purpose of authorizing and 12 facilitating the donation of <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs and

(3) As used in this section, the term:

(a) "Cancer drug" means a prescription drug that has been approved under s. 505 of the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act and is used to treat cancer or its side effects or is used to treat the side effects of a prescription drug used to treat cancer or its side effects. "Cancer drug" does not include a substance listed in Schedule II, Schedule III, Schedule IV, or Schedule V of s. 893.03.

(a) (b) "Closed drug delivery system" means a system in which the actual control of the unit-dose medication package is maintained by the facility rather than by the individual patient.

## 26 (b) "Dispensing practitioner" means a practitioner 27 registered under s. 465.0276.

(c) "Donor" means a patient or patient representative who 28 29 donates prescription cancer drugs or supplies needed to administer prescription cancer drugs that have been maintained 30 31 within a closed drug delivery system; health care facilities, nursing homes, hospices, or hospitals with closed drug delivery 32 33 systems; or pharmacies, prescription drug manufacturers, medical device manufacturers or suppliers, or wholesalers of 34 35 prescription drugs or supplies, in accordance with this section. 36 The term "Donor" includes a physician licensed under chapter 458 37 or chapter 459 who receives prescription cancer drugs or 38 supplies directly from a prescription drug manufacturer, 39 wholesale distributor, or pharmacy.

(d) "Eligible patient" means a person who the department
 determines is eligible to receive prescription cancer drugs from



42 the program.

(e) "Participant facility" means a class II hospital pharmacy or dispensing practitioner that has elected to participate in the program and that accepts donated prescription cancer drugs and supplies under the rules adopted by the department for the program.

(f) "Prescribing practitioner" means a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or any other medical professional with authority under state law to prescribe <u>drugs</u> cancer medication.

52 (g) "Prescription drug" does not include a substance listed 53 in Schedule II, Schedule III, Schedule IV, or Schedule V of s. 54 893.03.

(h) (g) "Program" means the <u>Prescription</u> Cancer Drug
 Donation Program created by this section.

57 <u>(i) (h)</u> "Supplies" means any supplies used in the 38 administration of a <u>prescription</u> cancer drug.

(4) Any donor may donate prescription cancer drugs or 59 60 supplies to a participant facility that elects to participate in the program and meets criteria established by the department for 61 62 such participation. Prescription Cancer drugs or supplies may 63 not be donated to a specific cancer patient, and donated prescription drugs or supplies may not be resold by the 64 65 participant program. Prescription Cancer drugs billed to and 66 paid for by Medicaid in long-term care facilities that are 67 eligible for return to stock under federal Medicaid regulations 68 shall be credited to Medicaid and are not eligible for donation under the program. A participant facility may provide dispensing 69 and counseling consulting services to an eligible patient 70



71 individuals who is are not a patient patients of the participant 72 hospital.

(5) The <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies donated to the program may be prescribed only by a prescribing practitioner for use by an eligible patient and may be dispensed only by a pharmacist or dispensing practitioner.

(6) (a) A <u>prescription</u> cancer drug may only be accepted or dispensed under the program if the drug is in its original, unopened, sealed container, or in a tamper-evident unit-dose packaging, except that a <u>prescription</u> cancer drug packaged in single-unit doses may be accepted and dispensed if the outside packaging is opened but the single-unit-dose packaging is unopened with tamper-resistant packaging intact.

(b) A <u>prescription</u> cancer drug may not be accepted or dispensed under the program if the drug bears an expiration date that is less than 6 months after the date the drug was donated or if the drug appears to have been tampered with or mislabeled as determined in paragraph (c).

(c) <u>Before</u> Prior to being dispensed to an eligible patient, the <u>prescription</u> cancer drug or supplies donated under the program shall be inspected by a pharmacist <u>or dispensing</u> <u>practitioner</u> to determine that the drug and supplies do not appear to have been tampered with or mislabeled.

94 (d) A dispenser of donated <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or 95 supplies may not submit a claim or otherwise seek reimbursement 96 from any public or private third-party payor for donated 97 <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs or supplies dispensed to any patient 98 under the program, and a public or private third-party payor is 99 not required to provide reimbursement to a dispenser for donated

100 prescription cancer drugs or supplies dispensed to any patient 101 under the program.

102 (7) (a) A donation of prescription cancer drugs or supplies 103 shall be made only at a participant's participant facility. A 104 participant facility may decline to accept a donation. A 105 participant facility that accepts donated prescription cancer 106 drugs or supplies under the program shall comply with all 107 applicable provisions of state and federal law relating to the 108 storage and dispensing of the donated prescription cancer drugs 109 or supplies.

(b) A participant facility that voluntarily takes part in the program may charge a handling fee sufficient to cover the cost of preparation and dispensing of prescription cancer drugs or supplies under the program. The fee shall be established in rules adopted by the department.

(8) The department, upon the recommendation of the Board of Pharmacy, shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this section. <del>Initial rules under this section shall be adopted no</del> <del>later than 90 days after the effective date of this act.</del> The rules shall include, but not be limited to:

(a) Eligibility criteria, including a method to determinepriority of eligible patients under the program.

(b) Standards and procedures for <u>participants</u> participant
 facilities that accept, store, distribute, or dispense donated
 prescription cancer drugs or supplies.

(c) Necessary forms for administration of the program, including, but not limited to, forms for use by entities that donate, accept, distribute, or dispense <u>prescription</u> <del>cancer</del> drugs or supplies under the program.

(d) The maximum handling fee that may be charged by a
participant facility that accepts and distributes or dispenses
donated prescription cancer drugs or supplies.

(e) Categories of <u>prescription</u> cancer drugs and supplies
that the program will accept for dispensing; however, the
department may exclude any drug based on its therapeutic
effectiveness or high potential for abuse or diversion.

(f) Maintenance and distribution of the participant
 facility registry established in subsection (10).

138 (9) A person who is eligible to receive prescription cancer 139 drugs or supplies under the state Medicaid program or under any 140 other prescription drug program funded in whole or in part by the state, by any other prescription drug program funded in 141 142 whole or in part by the Federal Government, or by any other prescription drug program offered by a third-party insurer, 143 unless benefits have been exhausted  $_{\overline{r}}$  or a certain prescription 144 cancer drug or supply is not covered by the prescription drug 145 program, is ineligible to participate in the program created 146 147 under this section.

(10) The department shall establish and maintain a 148 149 participant facility registry for the program. The participant facility registry shall include the participant's participant 150 151 facility's name, address, and telephone number. The department 152 shall make the participant facility registry available on the 153 department's website to any donor wishing to donate prescription 154 cancer drugs or supplies to the program. The department's 155 website shall also contain links to prescription cancer drug manufacturers that offer drug assistance programs or free 156 157 medication.



158 (11) Any donor of prescription cancer drugs or supplies, or 159 any participant in the program, who exercises reasonable care in donating, accepting, distributing, or dispensing prescription 160 161 cancer drugs or supplies under the program and the rules adopted 162 under this section is shall be immune from civil or criminal liability and from professional disciplinary action of any kind 163 for any injury, death, or loss to person or property relating to 164 165 such activities.

(12) A pharmaceutical manufacturer is not liable for any claim or injury arising from the transfer of any <u>prescription</u> <del>cancer</del> drug under this section, including, but not limited to, liability for failure to transfer or communicate product or consumer information regarding the transferred drug, as well as the expiration date of the transferred drug.

(13) If any conflict exists between the provisions in this
 section and the provisions in this chapter or chapter 465, the
 provisions in this section shall control the operation of the
 Cancer Drug Donation program.
