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10	That the following amendment to Section 1 of Article IX and													
11	the creation of Section 31 of Article XII of the State													
12	Constitution are agreed to and shall be submitted to the													
13	electors of this state for approval or rejection at the general													
14	election to be held in November 2010:

17	SECTION 1. Public education													
18	(a) The education of children is a fundamental value of													
19	the people of the State of Florida. It is, therefore, a													
20	paramount duty of the state to make adequate provision for the													
21	education of all children residing within its borders. Adequate													
22	provision shall be made by law for a uniform, efficient, safe,													
23	secure, and high quality system of free public schools that													
24	allows students to obtain a high quality education and for the													
25	establishment, maintenance, and operation of institutions of													
26	higher learning and other public education programs that the													
27	needs of the people may require. To assure that children													
28	attending public schools obtain a high quality education, the

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29 legislature shall make adequate provision to ensure that, by the 30 beginning of the <u>2010-2011</u> <del>2010</del> school year <u>and for each school</u> 31 <u>year thereafter</u>, there are a sufficient number of classrooms so 32 that:

(1) The <u>average</u> maximum number of students <u>at the school</u> <u>level</u> who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms for prekindergarten through grade 3 does not exceed 18 students <u>and the maximum number of students assigned</u> <u>to each teacher in an individual classroom does not exceed 21</u> students;

39 (2) The <u>average</u> maximum number of students <u>at the school</u> 40 <u>level</u> who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public 41 school classrooms for grades 4 through 8 does not exceed 22 42 students <u>and the maximum number of students assigned to each</u> 43 <u>teacher in an individual classroom does not exceed 27 students;</u>

(3) The <u>average</u> maximum number of students <u>at the school</u>
<u>level</u> who are assigned to each teacher who is teaching in public
school classrooms for grades 9 through 12 does not exceed 25
students <u>and the maximum number of students assigned to each</u>
<u>teacher in an individual classroom does not exceed 30 students</u>.

51 The class size requirements of this subsection do not apply to 52 extracurricular <u>or virtual</u> classes. Payment of the costs 53 associated with reducing class size to meet these requirements 54 is the responsibility of the state and not of local <u>school</u> 55 <del>schools</del> districts. <del>Beginning with the 2003-2004 fiscal year,</del> The 56 legislature shall provide sufficient funds to <u>maintain</u> <del>reduce</del>

57 the average number of students <u>required by</u> in each classroom by 58 at least two students per year until the maximum number of 59 students per classroom does not exceed the requirements of this 50 subsection.

61 Every four-year old child in Florida shall be provided (b) 62 by the State a high quality prekindergarten pre-kindergarten 63 learning opportunity in the form of an early childhood 64 development and education program which shall be voluntary, high 65 quality, free, and delivered according to professionally accepted standards. An early childhood development and education 66 67 program means an organized program designed to address and 68 enhance each child's ability to make age appropriate progress in 69 an appropriate range of settings in the development of language 70 and cognitive capabilities and emotional, social, regulatory, and moral capacities through education in basic skills and such 71 72 other skills as the Legislature may determine to be appropriate.

73 The early childhood education and development programs (C) 74 provided by reason of subsection subparagraph (b) shall be 75 implemented no later than the beginning of the 2005 school year 76 through funds generated in addition to those used for existing 77 education, health, and development programs. Existing education, 78 health, and development programs are those funded by the State 79 as of January 1, 2002, that provided for child or adult 80 education, health care, or development. 81 ARTICLE XII 82 SCHEDULE

83 <u>SECTION 31. Class size requirements for public</u> 84 <u>schools.--The amendment to Section 1 of Article IX, which</u>

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85 requires that the class size requirements for public schools 86 shall be based on the average number of students at the school 87 level who are assigned to a teacher in specified grades, and 88 this section, if submitted to the electors of this state for 89 approval or rejection at the next general election, shall take 90 effect upon approval by the electors and shall operate 91 retroactively to the beginning of the 2010-2011 school year. 92 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following statement be 93 placed on the ballot: 94 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 95 ARTICLE IX, SECTION 1 96 ARTICLE XII, SECTION 31 97 REVISION OF THE CLASS SIZE REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC 98 SCHOOLS. -- Proposes amendment of the State Constitution to 99 require that the class size requirements for public schools shall remain at the current limits but be based on the average 100 101 number of students at the school level, rather than on the 102 maximum number of students, who are assigned to each teacher who 103 is teaching in public school classrooms in specified grades. For 104 public school classrooms for prekindergarten through grade 3, 105 for grades 4 through 8, and for grades 9 through 12, limits the 106 maximum number of students who may be assigned to each teacher 107 in an individual classroom. Provides that class size 108 requirements do not apply to virtual classes. Modifies 109 requirements for funding to require that the Legislature provide sufficient funds to maintain the average number of students 110 required at the school level. Clarifies that these class size 111 requirements apply by the beginning of the 2010-2011 school year 112 Page 4 of 5

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and for each school year thereafter. Schedules these revisions to take effect upon approval by the electors of this state and to operate retroactively to the beginning of the 2010-2011
