An act relating to the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund; amending s. 201.15, F.S.; deleting provisions requiring that a portion of revenue from the excise tax on documents be credited to the fund; amending s. 379.208, F.S., relating to the purposes of the trust fund; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 201.15, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

14 201.15 Distribution of taxes collected.-All taxes collected 15 under this chapter are subject to the service charge imposed in 16 s. 215.20(1). Prior to distribution under this section, the 17 Department of Revenue shall deduct amounts necessary to pay the costs of the collection and enforcement of the tax levied by 18 19 this chapter. Such costs and the service charge may not be 20 levied against any portion of taxes pledged to debt service on 21 bonds to the extent that the costs and service charge are required to pay any amounts relating to the bonds. All taxes 22 23 remaining after deduction of costs and the service charge shall 24 be distributed as follows:

(1) Sixty-three and thirty-one hundredths percent of the remaining taxes collected under this chapter shall be used for the following purposes:

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28 (c) The remainder of the moneys distributed under this 29 subsection, after the required payments under paragraphs (a) and 30 (b), shall be paid into the State Treasury to the credit of:

1. The State Transportation Trust Fund in the Department of 32 Transportation in the amount of the lesser of 38.2 percent of 33 the remainder or \$541.75 million in each fiscal year, to be used 34 for the following specified purposes, notwithstanding any other 35 law to the contrary:

36 a. For the purposes of capital funding for the New Starts 37 Transit Program, authorized by Title 49, U.S.C. s. 5309 and specified in s. 341.051, 10 percent of these funds; 38

39 b. For the purposes of the Small County Outreach Program 40 specified in s. 339.2818, 5 percent of these funds;

c. For the purposes of the Strategic Intermodal System 41 42 specified in ss. 339.61, 339.62, 339.63, and 339.64, 75 percent 43 of these funds after allocating for the New Starts Transit 44 Program described in sub-subparagraph a. and the Small County 45 Outreach Program described in sub-subparagraph b.; and

46 d. For the purposes of the Transportation Regional 47 Incentive Program specified in s. 339.2819, 25 percent of these funds after allocating for the New Starts Transit Program 48 49 described in sub-subparagraph a. and the Small County Outreach 50 Program described in sub-subparagraph b.

51 2. The Water Protection and Sustainability Program Trust 52 Fund in the Department of Environmental Protection in the amount 53 of the lesser of 5.64 percent of the remainder or \$80 million in 54 each fiscal year, to be used as required by s. 403.890.

55 3. The Grants and Donations Trust Fund in the Department of 56 Community Affairs in the amount of the lesser of .23 percent of

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57	the remainder or \$3.25 million in each fiscal year, with 92
58	percent to be used to fund technical assistance to local
59	governments and school boards on the requirements and
60	implementation of this act and the remaining amount to be used
61	to fund the Century Commission established in s. 163.3247.
62	4. The Ecosystem Management and Restoration Trust Fund in
63	the amount of the lesser of 2.12 percent of the remainder or $$30$
64	million in each fiscal year, to be used for the preservation and
65	repair of the state's beaches as provided in ss. 161.091-
66	161.212.
67	5. The Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund in the
68	amount of the lesser of .14 percent of the remainder or \$2
69	million in each fiscal year, to be used for marine mammal care
70	as provided in s. 379.208(3).
71	5.6. General Inspection Trust Fund in the amount of the
72	lesser of .02 percent of the remainder or \$300,000 in each
73	fiscal year to be used to fund oyster management and restoration
74	programs as provided in s. 379.362(3).
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76	Moneys distributed pursuant to this paragraph may not be pledged
77	for debt service unless such pledge is approved by referendum of
78	the voters.
79	Section 2. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 379.208,
80	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
81	379.208 Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund;
82	purposes
83	(1) The Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund within the
84	Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission shall serve as a
85	broad-based depository for funds from various marine-related and
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86 boating-related activities and shall be administered by the 87 commission for the purposes of:

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(a) Funding for marine research.

(b) Funding for fishery enhancement, including, but not
limited to, fishery statistics development, artificial reefs,
and fish hatcheries.

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(c) Funding for marine law enforcement.

93 (d) Funding for administration of licensing programs for 94 recreational fishing, saltwater products sales, and related 95 information and education activities.

96 (e) Funding for the operations of the Fish and Wildlife97 Conservation Commission.

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(f) Funding for titling and registration of vessels.

99 (g) Funding for marine turtle protection, research, and 100 recovery activities from revenues that are specifically credited 101 to the trust fund for these purposes.

(h) Funding activities for rehabilitation of oyster
harvesting areas from which special oyster surcharge fees are
collected, including relaying and transplanting live oysters.

105 (i) Funding for boating research, boating-related programs106 and activities, and for law enforcement on state waters.

(j) Funding for the stone crab trap reduction program under
s. 379.365, the blue crab effort management program under s.
379.366, the spiny lobster trap certificate program under s.
379.3671, and the trap retrieval program under s. 379.2424.

111 (k) Funding to reimburse the cost of activities authorized 112 pursuant to the Fish and Wildlife Service of the United States 113 Department of the Interior. The facilities must be involved in 114 the actual rescue and full-time acute care, veterinarian-based

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115 rehabilitation of manatees. The cost of activities includes, but is not limited to, costs associated with expansion, capital 116 outlay, repair, maintenance, and operation related to the 117 118 rescue, treatment, stabilization, maintenance, release, and 119 monitoring of manatees. Moneys distributed through the 120 contractual agreement to each facility for manatee 121 rehabilitation must be proportionate to the number of manatees 122 under acute care rehabilitation, the number of maintenance days 123 medically necessary in the facility, and the number released 124 during the previous fiscal year. The commission may set a cap on 125 the total amount reimbursed per manatee per year. 126

(1) Funding for training on the care, treatment, and
 rehabilitation of marine mammals at the Whitney Laboratory and
 the College of Veterinary Medicine at the University of Florida.

(m) Funding for program administration costs of the agency.

130 (3) Funds provided to the Marine Resources Conservation 131 Trust Fund from taxes distributed under s. 201.15 shall be used 132 for the following purposes:

(a) To reimburse the cost of activities authorized pursuant 133 to the Fish and Wildlife Service of the United States Department 134 135 of the Interior. The facilities must be involved in the actual 136 rescue and full-time acute care veterinarian-based 137 rehabilitation of manatees. The cost of activities includes, but 138 is not limited to, costs associated with expansion, capital 139 outlay, repair, maintenance, and operation related to the 140 rescue, treatment, stabilization, maintenance, release, and 141 monitoring of manatees. Moneys distributed through the 142 contractual agreement to each facility for manatee 143 rehabilitation must be proportionate to the number of manatees

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144	under acute care rehabilitation; the number of maintenance days
145	medically necessary in the facility; and the number released
146	during the previous fiscal year. The commission may set a cap on
147	the total amount reimbursed per manatee per year.
148	(b) For training on the care, treatment, and rehabilitation
149	of marine mammals at the Whitney Laboratory and the College of
150	Veterinary Medicine at the University of Florida.
151	(c) For program administration costs of the agency.
152	(d) Funds not distributed in any 1 fiscal year must be
153	carried over for distribution in subsequent years.
154	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
