5 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 6 necessity that all complaints and related records in the custody 7 of a county or municipality that has established a local 8 investigatory process to enforce more stringent standards of 9 conduct and disclosure requirements as provided in s. 112.326, Florida Statutes, which relate to a complaint of a local ethics 10 11 violation be exempted from public-record and public-meeting requirements until the complaint is dismissed as legally 12 insufficient, until the alleged violator requests in writing 13

14 that such records and proceedings be made public, or until it is

15 determined, based on the investigation, whether probable cause

16 exists to believe that a violation has occurred. This exemption

17 is necessary because the release of such information could

18 potentially be defamatory to an individual under investigation,

19 cause unwarranted damage to the good name or reputation of such

20 individual, or significantly impair the investigation. The

21 exemption creates a secure environment in which a county or

22 municipality may conduct its investigation.
