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1 Representative Brandenburg offered the following:

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3 **Amendment to Amendment (841564) (with title amendment)**

4 Remove lines 23-51 and insert:

5 an ultrasound if the doctor and the patient agree that it is  
6 medically necessary, at the time the termination of pregnancy is  
7 to be performed.

8 (I) The ultrasound must be performed by the physician who  
9 is to perform the abortion or by a person having documented  
10 evidence that he or she has completed a course in the operation  
11 of ultrasound equipment, as prescribed by rule by the Department  
12 of Health, and who is working in conjunction with the physician.

13 (II) The person performing the ultrasound must, upon the  
14 patient's request, allow the woman to view the live ultrasound  
15 images, and a physician or a registered nurse, licensed  
16 practical nurse, advanced registered nurse practitioner, or

17 physician assistant working in conjunction with the physician  
 18 must, upon the patient's request, contemporaneously review and  
 19 explain the live ultrasound images to the woman prior to the  
 20 woman giving informed consent to having an abortion procedure  
 21 performed. However, this sub-sub-subparagraph does not apply if,  
 22 at the time the woman schedules or arrives for her appointment  
 23 to obtain an abortion, a copy of a restraining order, police  
 24 report, medical record, or other court order or documentation is  
 25 presented that evidences that the woman is obtaining the  
 26 abortion because the woman is a victim of rape, incest, domestic  
 27 violence, or human trafficking or that the woman has been  
 28 diagnosed as having a condition that, on the basis of a  
 29 physician's good faith clinical judgment, would create a serious  
 30 risk of substantial and irreversible impairment of a major  
 31 bodily function if the woman delayed terminating her pregnancy.

32 (III) The woman has a right to decline to view the  
 33 ultrasound images after she is informed of her right and offered  
 34 an opportunity to view them. If the woman declines to view the  
 35 ultrasound images, the woman may, if she volunteers to do so,
