2 An act relating to Indian River Mosquito Control District, 3 Indian River County; amending chapter 2006-344, Laws of 4 Florida; revising the powers of the board of commissioners 5 relating to the employment of certain persons; specifying 6 the provisions of law governing the election of 7 commissioners and removing obsolete provisions for the 8 staggering of initial terms; requiring the district to pay 9 for the surety bonds required of commissioners prior to 10 their assuming office; requiring commissioners to elect a 11 treasurer for the board; revising per diem and travel expense provisions for commissioners and employees; 12 revising powers of the board relating to the control of 13 14 mosquitoes and sandflies and deleting the power of the 15 board to eliminate all species of mosquitoes and sandflies 16 in the district; revising provisions relating to the board's purchasing, borrowing, and insurance requirements; 17 providing an effective date. 18 19 20 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 21 22 Section 1. Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 9, 10, and 11 of 23 section 3 of chapter 2006-344, Laws of Florida, are amended to 24 read:

25 Section 2. The governing body of said Indian River 26 Mosquito Control District shall be known and designated as the 27 "Board of Commissioners of Indian River Mosquito Control 28 District." Said governing body shall be composed of three

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29 members and shall have all the powers of a body corporate, 30 including the power to sue and be sued as a corporation in said 31 name in any court; to contract; to adopt and use a common seal 32 and alter the same at pleasure; to purchase, hold, lease, and 33 convey such real estate and personal property as said board may 34 deem proper to carry out the purposes of this act; to employ 35 appoint a director chief engineer, a consulting engineer, and an 36 attorney for said board and such other experts, consultants, 37 agents, and employees as said board may require; to borrow money 38 and to issue negotiable promissory notes or bonds therefor; and 39 to enable it to carry out the provisions of this act. The commissioners shall be elected in a nonpartisan election for 4-40 year terms pursuant to section 189.405, Florida Statutes, and 41 42 consistent with the Florida Election Code so that one 43 commissioner is elected at one general election by the highest 44 number of votes cast and two commissioners are elected by the 45 first and second highest number of votes cast at the next 46 ensuing general election.

47 Section 3. Each commissioner under this act, before he or she assumes office, shall be required to give to Indian River 48 49 Mosquito Control District a good and sufficient surety bond in 50 the sum of \$5,000, conditioned for the faithful performance of 51 the duties of his or her office, said bond to be approved by and 52 filed with the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Indian River County 53 and the expense of said bond to be borne by the Indian River Mosquito Control District. Said bond shall also be recorded in 54 55 the minutes of said Board of Commissioners of said Indian River Mosquito Control District. The failure of any person so elected 56 Page 2 of 8

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57 as commissioner of Indian River Mosquito Control District within 58 30 days after his or her election to give bond shall create a 59 vacancy as to such commissioner, and such vacancy shall be 60 filled by the Governor appointing a person duly qualified to 61 hold such office, which manner of filling such office shall 62 obtain in the case of resignation, death, or removal from said 63 district of any commissioner during his or her term of office. 64 No person shall be qualified to hold office as a commissioner 65 under this act unless such person shall be a duly qualified elector of said district. 66

67 Section 4. As soon as practicable after each general election, the commissioners of Indian River Mosquito Control 68 69 District, after their qualification as such, shall meet and 70 organize by the election, from among their number, of a chair, a 71 vice chair, a treasurer, and a secretary. Two members of the 72 board shall constitute a quorum. The vote of two members shall 73 be necessary to transact business. The chair and vice chair 74 shall vote at all meetings of the board.

75 Section 5. The commissioners and employees under this act 76 shall be paid for each day's service and for each mile actually 77 traveled in going to and from the office of the Board of 78 Commissioners of Indian River Mosquito Control District 79 according to per diem compensation expense and mileage rates 80 established from time to time for officials and employees of the state pursuant to section 112.061, Florida Statutes. The per 81 82 diem herein provided for shall apply to services rendered for 83 inspection of work performed for the district or other services 84 under this act. Additionally, commissioners shall be compensated Page 3 of 8

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for regular duties, as provided by general law or special act, at the rate of \$400 per month or such greater amount as may be permitted by general law or special act.

88 Section 7. Said board is hereby authorized and empowered 89 to do any and all things necessary for the control and complete elimination of all species of mosquitoes and sandflies and 90 91 diseases transmitted by the same in said district and, for this 92 purpose, is hereby authorized and empowered to construct and 93 thereafter to maintain canals, ditches, drains, and dikes; to fill in all depressions, lakes, and ponds or marshes that are 94 95 the breeding places of mosquitoes and sandflies, insofar as said 96 work does not interfere with the water supply of any city or community; and to employ engineers, scientists, helpers, and all 97 98 other contractors servants, agents, and employees as may be 99 necessary for the purpose of controlling and eliminating all 100 species of mosquitoes and sandflies in said district. Said board is hereby authorized and empowered to spray or otherwise 101 102 disburse, or cause to be sprayed or otherwise disbursed, 103 chemicals, substances, and materials of every nature upon and 104 over the area of said district as shall be deemed necessary or 105 desirable for the purpose of controlling and eliminating all 106 species of mosquitoes and sandflies in said district and, for 107 such purposes, may contract for and purchase such chemicals, substances, and materials and may contract for the spraying or 108 disbursing thereof over the area of said district or may employ 109 110 such agents, entities servants, and employees for such purpose 111 as the commissioners of said district may deem necessary or advisable; to do any and all things that may be necessary from 112 Page 4 of 8

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113 the standpoint of public health and comfort to control or eliminate mosquitoes and sandflies or their larvae in said district; and to promulgate such rules and regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this act and with any of the laws of said state which, in their judgment, may be necessary for the proper carrying into effect and enforcement of this act.

119 Section 9. Said board is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase goods, supplies, or material for the use of said 120 121 district without the necessity of advertising any notice or calling for bids regarding said purchase when the amount to be 122 123 paid therefor by said district does not exceed the competitive 124 bid and advertising requirement amounts pursuant to chapter 287, 125 Florida Statutes \$10,000 or when the goods, supplies, or 126 materials to be purchased are obtainable from only one source or 127 supplier.

128 Section 10. Said board is hereby authorized and empowered 129 to levy upon all the real and personal taxable property in said 130 district a special tax not exceeding 10 mills on the dollar for 131 the year 1947 and for each and every year thereafter, to be used 132 solely in carrying out the purposes of this act. Said levy shall 133 be made not later than the 15th of July of each year by 134 resolution of said board, or a majority thereof, duly entered at 135 large upon its minutes. A certified copy of such resolution 136 executed in the name of said board by its chair and secretary and under its corporate seals shall be delivered or transmitted 137 to the Board of County Commissioners of Indian River County, and 138 a copy shall be transmitted by mail to the Chief Financial 139 Officer not later than August 1 of each year. It shall be the 140

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duty of the Board of County Commissioners of Indian River County 141 142 to order the property appraiser of said county to assess and the collector of said county to collect the amount of said tax so 143 144 assessed by the Board of Commissioners of said district upon all 145 the taxable property, real or personal, in said district at the 146 rate of taxation adopted by said board for said year, but not 147 exceeding 10 mills on the dollar and as specified in said resolution, and said levy shall be included in the warrant to 148 149 the tax collector and the property appraiser which is attached 150 to the assessment roll of taxes for said county each year. The 151 property appraiser shall make such assessment and the tax 152 collector shall collect such taxes so levied in the manner as 153 other taxes are assessed and collected and shall pay the same 154 when collected, within the time and in the manner prescribed by 155 law for the payment of other taxes, to the secretary of said 156 Board of Commissioners. It shall be the duty of said Chief 157 Financial Officer to assess and levy on all the railroad lines 158 and railroad property, telegraph lines and telegraph property, 159 and telephone lines and telephone property the amount of every 160 such levy herewith provided in this section, and as in the case 161 of other state and county taxes, and said taxes so levied by the 162 Chief Financial Officer shall be collected as provided for other similar taxes, and the proceeds thereof shall be remitted to the 163 164 secretary of said board in the same manner as such remittances are made in the collection of other taxes. If any such taxes so 165 166 assessed are not paid, the said property shall be sold by said 167 tax collector and certificates issued and tax deeds issued in the same manner and under the same laws relating to the sales, 168

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169 issuance of certificates, and deeds with reference to all other 170 state and county taxes. The Board of Commissioners of the Indian 171 River Mosquito Control District is herewith authorized to borrow 172 in any one tax year a sum not to exceed 80 percent of the 173 estimated taxes to be collected on behalf of said district 174 within such year and issue negotiable promissory notes and bonds 175 or such necessary instruments to secure said loan to enable the 176 board to carry out the provisions of this act to evidence such 177 loan made to said district by its tax anticipation note or notes 178 bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 10 percent per annum, 179 and which notes shall be payable at a time not greater than 1 180 year from the date of the borrowing of such moneys; the sums so 181 borrowed shall be repaid out of the next taxes collected by said 182 district to the extent necessary for the repayment thereof, 183 together with such interest at a rate not to exceed 6 percent 184 per annum; and no sums shall be borrowed as herewith provided in 185 any subsequent year unless all moneys so borrowed in any 186 preceding year shall have been entirely paid as to both 187 principal and interest.

188 Section 11. In addition to all other powers granted to the 189 district by law, the Indian River Mosquito Control District, 190 acting by and through its duly qualified board of commissioners, 191 shall have the power to purchase and pay for insurance as a 192 legitimate public expenditure without waiving its right to 193 defend any action filed against it on the grounds of sovereign immunity while reserving all rights and defenses available Said 194 board is hereby required to secure and keep in force in 195 196 companies duly authorized to do business in Florida insurance Page 7 of 8

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197 covering liability for property damage or bodily injury or death 198 resulting therefrom to all persons and property by reason of the 199 ownership, maintenance, operation, or use of any vehicle, 200 dragline, dredge, tractor, and related equipment being used for 201 and in the interest of the purpose of said board in amounts not 202 less than \$50,000 for bodily injury or death resulting therefrom 203 to any one person, and not less than \$100,000 for bodily injury 204 or death resulting therefrom for any one accident, and not less 205 than \$25,000 for damage to property. 206

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.

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
