13 materials" means items having intellectual content that by design serve as a major tool for assisting in the instruction of 14 15 a subject or course. These items may be available in bound, unbound, kit, or package form and may consist of hardbacked or 16 17 softbacked textbooks, electronic content, consumables, learning laboratories, manipulatives, electronic media, and computer 18 19 courseware or software. The term does not include electronic or computer hardware even if such hardware is bundled with software 20 21 or other electronic media, nor does it include equipment or 22 supplies. A publisher or manufacturer providing instructional 23 materials as a single bundle shall also make the instructional 24 materials available as separate and unbundled items, each priced 25 individually. Any instructional materials adopted after 2012-26 2013 for students in grades 9 through 12 shall be provided 27 primarily in an electronic format. Section 20. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 28 29 1006.33, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 30 1006.33 Bids or proposals; advertisement and its contents.-31 (1)(b) The advertisement shall state that, beginning in 2010-32 2011, each bidder shall furnish electronic specimen copies of 33 all instructional materials submitted, at a time designated by 34

the department, which specimen copies shall be identical with

the copies approved and accepted by the members of the state

district school superintendents, as provided in this part. Any
