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Proposed Committee Substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

A bill to be entitled An act relating to home and community-based services; amending s. 393.0661, F.S.; reducing the annual

maximum expenditure to each client assigned by the Agency for Persons With Disabilities to tier one, tier two, tier three, and tier four level services; eliminating behavior assistants as a deliverable service to eligible clients; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (f) of subsection (3) of section 393.0661, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

393.0661 Home and community-based services delivery system; 16 17 comprehensive redesign.-The Legislature finds that the home and 18 community-based services delivery system for persons with 19 developmental disabilities and the availability of appropriated 20 funds are two of the critical elements in making services available. Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature that 21 2.2 the Agency for Persons with Disabilities shall develop and 23 implement a comprehensive redesign of the system.

(3) The Agency for Health Care Administration, in consultation with the agency, shall seek federal approval and implement a four-tiered waiver system to serve eligible clients through the developmental disabilities and family and supported

28 living waivers. The agency shall assign all clients receiving 29 services through the developmental disabilities waiver to a tier 30 based on a valid assessment instrument, client characteristics, 31 and other appropriate assessment methods.

(a) Tier one is limited to clients who have service needs 32 33 that cannot be met in tier two, three, or four for intensive 34 medical or adaptive needs and that are essential for avoiding 35 institutionalization, or who possess behavioral problems that 36 are exceptional in intensity, duration, or frequency and present 37 a substantial risk of harm to themselves or others. Total annual 38 expenditures under tier one may not exceed \$120,000 per client 39 each year.

(b) Tier two is limited to clients whose service needs 40 include a licensed residential facility and who are authorized 41 to receive a moderate level of support for standard residential 42 43 habilitation services or a minimal level of support for behavior focus residential habilitation services, or clients in supported 44 45 living who receive more than 6 hours a day of in-home support services. Total annual expenditures under tier two may not 46 exceed \$49,500 \$55,000 per client each year. 47

(c) Tier three includes, but is not limited to, clients requiring residential placements, clients in independent or supported living situations, and clients who live in their family home. Total annual expenditures under tier three may not exceed \$31,500 \$35,000 per client each year.

(d) Tier four is the family and supported living waiver and includes, but is not limited to, clients in independent or supported living situations and clients who live in their family home. Total annual expenditures under tier four may not exceed

57 \$13,313 \$14,792 per client each year.

(f) The agency shall seek federal waivers and amend contracts as necessary to make changes to services defined in federal waiver programs administered by the agency as follows:

61 1. Supported living coaching services may not exceed 20
62 hours per month for persons who also receive in-home support
63 services.

64 2. Limited support coordination services is the only type
65 of support coordination service that may be provided to persons
66 under the age of 18 who live in the family home.

3. Personal care assistance services are limited to 180
hours per calendar month and may not include rate modifiers.
Additional hours may be authorized for persons who have
intensive physical, medical, or adaptive needs if such hours are
essential for avoiding institutionalization.

4. Residential habilitation services are limited to 8 hours 72 73 per day. Additional hours may be authorized for persons who have intensive medical or adaptive needs and if such hours are 74 75 essential for avoiding institutionalization, or for persons who 76 possess behavioral problems that are exceptional in intensity, 77 duration, or frequency and present a substantial risk of harming 78 themselves or others. This restriction shall be in effect until 79 the four-tiered waiver system is fully implemented.

5. Chore services, nonresidential support services, and homemaker services are eliminated. The agency shall expand the definition of in-home support services to allow the service provider to include activities previously provided in these eliminated services.

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6. Massage therapy, medication review, behavior assistant

86 <u>services</u>, and psychological assessment services are eliminated.
87 7. The agency shall conduct supplemental cost plan reviews
88 to verify the medical necessity of authorized services for plans
89 that have increased by more than 8 percent during either of the
90 2 preceding fiscal years.

91 8. The agency shall implement a consolidated residential 92 habilitation rate structure to increase savings to the state 93 through a more cost-effective payment method and establish 94 uniform rates for intensive behavioral residential habilitation 95 services.

96 9. Pending federal approval, the agency may extend current 97 support plans for clients receiving services under Medicaid 98 waivers for 1 year beginning July 1, 2007, or from the date 99 approved, whichever is later. Clients who have a substantial 100 change in circumstances which threatens their health and safety 101 may be reassessed during this year in order to determine the 102 necessity for a change in their support plan.

103 10. The agency shall develop a plan to eliminate 104 redundancies and duplications between in-home support services, 105 companion services, personal care services, and supported living 106 coaching by limiting or consolidating such services.

107 11. The agency shall develop a plan to reduce the intensity 108 and frequency of supported employment services to clients in 109 stable employment situations who have a documented history of at 110 least 3 years' employment with the same company or in the same 111 industry.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
