Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

3 Delete everything after the enacting clause 4 and insert: 5 Section 1. Section 381.0404, Florida Statutes, is repealed. 6 Section 2. Section 381.85, Florida Statutes, is repealed. 7 Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 8 381.855, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 9 381.855 Florida Center for Universal Research to Eradicate 10 Disease.-

(5) There is established within the center an advisory council that shall meet at least annually.

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13	(a) The council shall consist of one representative from a
14	Florida not-for-profit institution engaged in basic and clinical
15	biomedical research and education which receives more than \$10
16	million in annual grant funding from the National Institutes of
17	Health, to be appointed by the State Surgeon General from a
18	different institution each term, and one representative from and
19	appointed by each of the following entities:

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42	Cancer Research Program
43	(2) The program shall provide grants for cancer research to
44	further the search for cures for cancer.
45	(a) Emphasis shall be given to the <u>following</u> goals
46	enumerated in s. 381.921, as those goals support the advancement
47	of such cures <u>:</u> -
48	1. Efforts to significantly expand cancer research capacity
49	in the state by:
50	a. Identifying ways to attract new research talent and
51	attendant national grant-producing researchers to cancer
52	research facilities in this state;
53	b. Implementing a peer-reviewed, competitive process to
54	identify and fund the best proposals to expand cancer research
55	institutes in this state;
56	c. Funding through available resources for those proposals
57	that demonstrate the greatest opportunity to attract federal
58	research grants and private financial support;
59	d. Encouraging the employment of bioinformatics in order to
60	create a cancer informatics infrastructure that enhances
61	information and resource exchange and integration through
62	researchers working in diverse disciplines, to facilitate the
63	full spectrum of cancer investigations;
64	e. Facilitating the technical coordination, business
65	development, and support of intellectual property as it relates
66	to the advancement of cancer research; and
67	f. Aiding in other multidisciplinary research-support
68	activities as they inure to the advancement of cancer research.
69	2. Efforts to improve both research and treatment through
70	greater participation in clinical trials networks by:

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71	a. Identifying ways to increase adult enrollment in cancer
72	clinical trials;
73	b. Supporting public and private professional education
74	programs designed to increase the awareness and knowledge about
75	cancer clinical trials;
76	c. Providing tools to cancer patients and community-based
77	oncologists to aid in the identification of cancer clinical
78	trials available in the state; and
79	d. Creating opportunities for the state's academic cancer
80	centers to collaborate with community-based oncologists in
81	cancer clinical trials networks.
82	3. Efforts to reduce the impact of cancer on disparate
83	groups by:
84	a. Identifying those cancers that disproportionately impact
85	certain demographic groups; and
86	b. Building collaborations designed to reduce health
87	disparities as they relate to cancer.
88	(b) Preference may be given to grant proposals that foster
89	collaborations among institutions, researchers, and community
90	practitioners, as such proposals support the advancement of
91	cures through basic or applied research, including clinical
92	trials involving cancer patients and related networks.
93	(5) Funds appropriated for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead,
94	Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program shall be
95	distributed pursuant to this section to provide grants to
96	researchers seeking cures for cancer and cancer-related
97	illnesses, with emphasis given to the goals enumerated in <u>this</u>
98	section s. 381.921. From the total funds appropriated, an amount
99	of up to 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses. In



100	the 2009-2010 fiscal year, 2.5 percent, not to exceed \$25
101	million, of the revenue deposited into the Health Care Trust
102	Fund pursuant to s. 215.5602(12)(a) shall be transferred to the
103	Biomedical Research Trust Fund within the Department of Health
104	for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer
105	Research Program.
106	Section 8. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
