Section 16. Subsection (2) of section 627.668, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

627.668 Optional coverage for mental and nervous disorders required; exception.-

9 (2) Under group policies or contracts, inpatient hospital
10 benefits, partial hospitalization benefits, and outpatient
11 benefits consisting of durational limits, dollar amounts,
12 deductibles, and coinsurance factors shall not be less favorable

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13 for the necessary care and treatment of childhood ADD/ADHD, as well as those psychiatric, developmental, psychotic, mood, and 14 15 anxiety disorders that are prescribed in the most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 16 17 published by the American Psychiatric Association, than for physical illness generally. For all other mental and nervous 18 19 disorders not defined in this subsection, the durational limits, dollar amounts, deductibles, and coinsurance factors shall be 20 21 made available to the extent than for physical illness 22 generally, except that:

(a) Inpatient benefits may be limited to not less than 30
days per benefit year as defined in the policy or contract. If
inpatient hospital benefits are provided beyond 30 days per
benefit year, the durational limits, dollar amounts, and
coinsurance factors thereto need not be the same as applicable
to physical illness generally.

29 (b) Outpatient benefits may be limited to \$1,000 for consultations with a licensed physician, a psychologist licensed 30 pursuant to chapter 490, a mental health counselor licensed 31 32 pursuant to chapter 491, a marriage and family therapist 33 licensed pursuant to chapter 491, and a clinical social worker licensed pursuant to chapter 491. If benefits are provided 34 beyond the \$1,000 per benefit year, the durational limits, 35 36 dollar amounts, and coinsurance factors thereof need not be the 37 same as applicable to physical illness generally. 38
