Section 1. Section 193.1552, Florida Statutes, is created

193.1552 Assessment of properties affected by imported

(1) As used in this section, the term "imported drywall"

means drywall that contains elevated levels of elemental sulfur

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13	(2) When a property appraiser determines that a single-
14	family residential property is affected by imported drywall and
15	needs remediation to bring that property up to current building
16	standards, the property appraiser shall adjust the assessed
17	value of that property by taking into consideration the presence
18	of the imported drywall and the impact of such drywall on the
19	assessed value. If the building cannot be used for its intended
20	purpose without remediation or repair, the value of such
21	building shall be assessed at the nominal just value of \$0.
22	(3) This section applies only to properties in which:
23	(a) Imported drywall was used in the construction of the
24	property or an improvement to the property.
25	(b) The imported drywall has a significant negative impact
26	on the just value of the property or improvement.
27	(c) The purchaser was unaware of the imported drywall at
28	the time of purchase.
29	(4) This section does not apply to property owners who were
30	aware of the presence of imported drywall at the time of
31	purchase.
32	(5) Homestead property to which this section applies shall
33	be considered damaged by misfortune or calamity under s.
34	193.155(4)(b), except that the 3-year deadline does not apply.
35	(6) Homestead property shall not be considered abandoned
36	when a homeowner vacates such property for the purpose of
37	remediation and repair under this section, provided the
38	homeowner does not establish a new homestead.
39	(7) Upon the substantial completion of remediation and
40	repairs, the property shall be assessed as if such imported
41	drywall had not been present.
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42	(8) This section is repealed July 1, 2017, unless reviewed
43	and reenacted by the Legislature on or before that date.
