Section 9. Subsection (7) is added to section 341.051, Florida Statutes, to read:

341.051 Administration and financing of public transit and intercity bus service programs and projects.-

(7) INTEROPERABLE FARE COLLECTION SYSTEMS.-

(a) The Legislature recognizes the importance of

encouraging the seamless use of local and regional public

transportation systems by residents of and visitors to the state

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13 wherever possible. The paramount concern is to encourage the implementation of fare collection systems that are interoperable 14 15 and compatible with multiple public transportation systems 16 throughout the state. 17 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 18 contrary, in order to facilitate the ease of transfer from one 19 public transportation system to another, any public transit 20 system which connects directly with a new public rail system put 21 into service after December 1, 2010, and which is adding a new 22 fare media system or is upgrading its existing fare media system 23 shall use a universal common contactless fare media that is 24 compatible with the American Public Transportation Association's 25 Contactless Fare Media System Standard and allows users to 26 purchase fares at a single point of sale with coin, cash, or 27 credit card. This paragraph does not require the use of a 28 universal common contactless fare media for the paratransit 29 element of any transit system or by any public transit system that does not share one or more points of origin or destination 30 31 with a public rail system. 32 For purposes of this section, the term "net operating 33 34 costs" means all operating costs of a project less any federal funds, fares, or other sources of income to the project. 35 36 Section 10. Subsection (7) of section 341.3025, Florida 37 Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (8), and a new subsection 38 (7) is added to that section to read: 39 341.3025 Multicounty public rail system fares and 40 enforcement.-41 (7) (a) The Legislature recognizes the importance of

56	Media System Standard and allows users to purchase fares at a
57	single point of sale with coin, cash, or credit card.
58	Additionally, any existing public rail system that is adding a
59	new fare media system or is upgrading its existing fare media
60	system shall use a universal common contactless fare media that
61	is compatible with the American Public Transportation
62	Association's Contactless Fare Media System Standard and allows
63	users to purchase fares at a single point of sale with coin,
64	cash, or credit card.
