A bill to be entitled

An act relating to international development relief and outreach activities in Haiti; creating s. 288.0252, F.S.; providing a definition; requiring the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development to contract with the state's international volunteer corps to provide certain relief activities for the people of Haiti; requiring that such activities focus on certain rural Haitian communities; requiring that such activities be conducted by volunteers with certain qualifications; directing the international volunteer corps to raise public and private funding to support the relief activities; authorizing the international volunteer corps to establish certain partnerships and build long-term relationships; providing for the award of grants to certain grassroots organizations; providing that professionals licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation shall receive continuing education credit for certain volunteer services provided in Haiti; providing for future repeal; providing appropriations; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 288.0252, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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288.0252 International development relief and outreach activities in Haiti.—

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(1) As used in this section, the term "international volunteer corps" means the Florida Association for Volunteer Action in the Caribbean and the Americas, Inc.

- (2) The Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development shall contract with the state's international volunteer corps to provide the following rescue, recovery, rebuilding, and sustainable humanitarian outreach activities for the people of the Republic of Haiti:
- (a) Emergency disaster response and recovery, including food and relief supply distribution, coordination with existing relief efforts, and the support of firefighters, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and urban search and rescue professionals.
- (b) Health care, including emergency rescue, emergency medical services, and post-traumatic stress counseling.
- (c) Domestic security, including the improvement of local food security.
- (d) Rebuilding, including alternative energy placement and structural engineering to assess damage to buildings, infrastructure, and other construction essential to the recovery and rebuilding of the country.
- (e) Sustainable economic development, including job creation, enterprise development, and the recovery of agriculture.
- (3) Such activities shall focus on rural communities receiving Haitian refugees and other residents from disasterstricken or otherwise impoverished areas of the country.
- (4) The international volunteer corps must require that such activities be conducted by qualified volunteers who are

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citizens of the state and who each have at least 5 years of experience in coordinating international volunteer programs in Haiti.

- (5) The international volunteer corps shall, to the maximum extent practicable, leverage the state funding provided to implement this section by raising funds from public and private sources, including, but not limited to, the Federal Government and charitable foundations, to support the activities described in subsection (2).
- (6) To support the activities described in subsection (2), the international volunteer corps may:
- (a) Establish partnerships with organizations and individuals.
- (b) Build long-term social and economic relationships with businesses and organizations based in this state.
- (c) Award grants of at least \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000 to grassroots organizations in this state that have previously completed successful international volunteer corps assignments in Haiti.
- (7) Notwithstanding any provision of law, a professional licensed by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation shall receive one continuing education credit or unit, regardless of required categories, for each hour of volunteer service provided in Haiti in coordination with the state's international volunteer corps, not to exceed 100 percent of his or her annual professional requirement for continuing education.
- (8) This section is repealed July 1, 2020, unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature before that date.

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Section 2. The recurring sum of \$2 million is appropriated annually from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of Tourism,

Trade, and Economic Development for the 2010-2011, 2011-2012,

2012-2013, 2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016, 2016-2017, 2017
2018, 2018-2019, and 2019-2020 fiscal years for the purpose of implementing s. 288.0252, Florida Statutes.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
