An act relating to state uniform traffic control; creating s. 316.3035, F.S.; prohibiting the use of an electronic communication device to send or receive text-based communications while operating a motor vehicle; defining the term "text-based communication";

providing exceptions; providing for enforcement; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 316.3035, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

316.3035 Use of electronic communication devices.-

- (1) (a) A person may not operate a motor vehicle on any highway while using an electronic communication device to compose, send, read, or view a text-based communication while the vehicle is on a roadway, as defined in s. 316.003(42).
- (b) As used in this section, the term "text-based communication" means a digital communication that is manually created to be electronically transmitted between physical devices, and includes text messaging, e-mail, instant messaging, paging, or a command or request to access an Internet page.
 - (2) This section does not apply to:
- (a) A law enforcement officer or emergency medical services personnel in the performance of their official duties.
 - (b) A person requesting medical or emergency assistance.
- (c) A person reporting illegal activity, a traffic accident, a traffic crash, or a road hazard that threatens

- (d) A member of the Armed Forces of the United States while operating a military vehicle.
- (e) A person in a vehicle that is at rest in a shoulder lane or that is lawfully parked.
- (3) This section does not authorize the seizure and forfeiture of a wireless communication device unless otherwise provided by law.
- (4) A violation of this section is a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a nonmoving violation as provided in chapter 318.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
