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29	administered by the state shall be required to have 66 percent
30	of their onsite employees, independent contractors, or other
31	individuals providing onsite services be Florida residents.
32	(3) This act applies to all public works projects that
33	have a commencement date of July 1, 2009, through July 1, 2012.
34	Commencement of a project shall be deemed the first date of
35	physical construction at a worksite.
36	(4) State agencies and private sector contractors subject
37	to the provisions of this act who provide services to public
38	works projects commencing prior to July 1, 2010, shall have 60
39	days to comply with the provisions of this act.
40	(5) A private sector contractor who fails to comply with
41	the provisions of this act, or attempts in bad faith to
42	circumvent the provisions of this act, commits a noncriminal
43	infraction, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$5,000 for each
44	day in noncompliance.
45	(6) For purposes of this act, "Florida resident" means a
46	person who has had a valid Florida driver's license or Florida
47	identification card or has declared his or her homestead
48	property in this state for at least 1 year prior to July 1,
49	2009, or the date of commencement of the project, whichever
50	occurs later.
51	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.

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
