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Senate Amendment (with title amendment) Between lines 156 and 157

The Committee on Judiciary (Fasano) recommended the following:

4 insert:

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8 9 Section 7. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 316.640, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.640 Enforcement.-The enforcement of the traffic laws of this state is vested as follows:

(1) STATE.—

(a)1.a. The Division of Florida Highway Patrol of the
Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; the Division of
Law Enforcement of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation
Commission; the Division of Law Enforcement of the Department of

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14 Environmental Protection; law enforcement officers of the 15 Department of Transportation; law enforcement officers empowered 16 under s. 626.989 when such enforcement is related to active investigations, and the agents, inspectors, and officers of the 17 18 Department of Law Enforcement each have authority to enforce all of the traffic laws of this state on all the streets and 19 20 highways thereof and elsewhere throughout the state wherever the 21 public has a right to travel by motor vehicle.

23 This sub-subparagraph shall take effect January 1, 2011.

24 b. University police officers shall have authority to 25 enforce all of the traffic laws of this state when violations 26 occur on or within 1,000 feet of any property or facilities that 27 are under the guidance, supervision, regulation, or control of a 28 state university, a direct-support organization of such state 29 university, or any other organization controlled by the state 30 university or a direct-support organization of the state university, or when such violations occur within a specified 31 32 jurisdictional area as agreed upon in a mutual aid agreement 33 entered into with a law enforcement agency pursuant to s. 34 23.1225(1). Traffic laws may also be enforced off-campus when 35 hot pursuit originates on or within 1,000 feet of any such 36 property or facilities, or as agreed upon in accordance with the 37 mutual aid agreement.

38 c. Community college police officers shall have the 39 authority to enforce all the traffic laws of this state only 40 when such violations occur on any property or facilities that 41 are under the guidance, supervision, regulation, or control of 42 the community college system.

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d. Police officers employed by an airport authority shall
have the authority to enforce all of the traffic laws of this
state only when such violations occur on any property or
facilities that are owned or operated by an airport authority.

47 (I) An airport authority may employ as a parking enforcement specialist any individual who successfully completes 48 49 a training program established and approved by the Criminal 50 Justice Standards and Training Commission for parking 51 enforcement specialists but who does not otherwise meet the 52 uniform minimum standards established by the commission for law 53 enforcement officers or auxiliary or part-time officers under s. 54 943.12. Nothing in this sub-sub-subparagraph shall be construed to permit the carrying of firearms or other weapons, nor shall 55 56 such parking enforcement specialist have arrest authority.

(II) A parking enforcement specialist employed by an airport authority is authorized to enforce all state, county, and municipal laws and ordinances governing parking only when such violations are on property or facilities owned or operated by the airport authority employing the specialist, by appropriate state, county, or municipal traffic citation.

e. The Office of Agricultural Law Enforcement of the
Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall have the
authority to enforce traffic laws of this state.

f. School safety officers shall have the authority to
enforce all of the traffic laws of this state when such
violations occur on or about any property or facilities which
are under the guidance, supervision, regulation, or control of
the district school board.

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2. An agency of the state as described in subparagraph 1.



72 is prohibited from establishing a traffic citation quota. A 73 violation of this subparagraph is not subject to the penalties 74 provided in chapter 318.

75 3. Any disciplinary action taken or performance evaluation 76 conducted by an agency of the state as described in subparagraph 77 1. of a law enforcement officer's traffic enforcement activity 78 must be in accordance with written work-performance standards. 79 Such standards must be approved by the agency and any collective 80 bargaining unit representing such law enforcement officer. A 81 violation of this subparagraph is not subject to the penalties 82 provided in chapter 318.

83 4. The Division of the Florida Highway Patrol may employ as a traffic accident investigation officer any individual who 84 85 successfully completes instruction in traffic accident investigation and court presentation through the Selective 86 87 Traffic Enforcement Program as approved by the Criminal Justice 88 Standards and Training Commission and funded through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration or a similar 89 90 program approved by the commission, but who does not necessarily meet the uniform minimum standards established by the commission 91 92 for law enforcement officers or auxiliary law enforcement 93 officers under chapter 943. Any such traffic accident investigation officer who makes an investigation at the scene of 94 95 a traffic accident may issue traffic citations, based upon 96 personal investigation, when he or she has reasonable and 97 probable grounds to believe that a person who was involved in 98 the accident committed an offense under this chapter, chapter 319, chapter 320, or chapter 322 in connection with the 99 100 accident. This subparagraph does not permit the officer to carry
