(1) The Fiscal Stability Trust Fund is created within the state courts system. Funds credited to the trust fund shall consist of revenues appropriated from the General Revenue Fund consisting of 1 percent of the state budget for the current fiscal year. The trust fund shall be administered by the Supreme Court. The funds shall be used to support the activities carried out under s. 25.382 and to allocate funds to a judicial branch supplies or reserve fund monitored by the Logislature. The
