6. Effective October 1, 2012, passage of an examination administered by the department which measures the applicant's competency and proficiency in the subject material of the public safety telecommunication training program.

9 <u>(e) (c)</u> The department shall establish by rule a procedure 10 <u>that requires 20 hours of training</u> for the biennial renewal 11 certification of 911 <u>public safety telecommunicators</u> emergency 12 dispatchers.

13 (f) (d) A Each 911 public safety telecommunicator emergency dispatcher certificate expires automatically if not renewed at 14 15 the end of the 2-year period and may be renewed if the holder 16 meets the qualifications for renewal as established by the 17 department. A certificate that is not renewed at the end of the 2-year period automatically reverts to an inactive status for a 18 19 period that may not exceed 180 days. Such certificate may be 20 reactivated and renewed within the 180-day period if the 21 certificateholder meets all other qualifications for renewal and 22 pays a \$50 late fee. Reactivation shall be in a manner and on 23 forms prescribed by department rule.

24 <u>(g) (e)</u> The department may suspend or revoke a certificate 25 at any time if it determines that the certificateholder does not 26 meet the applicable qualifications.

27 (h) (f) A certificateholder may request that his or her 911 28 public safety telecommunicator emergency dispatcher certificate 29 be placed on inactive status by applying to the department 30 before his or her current certification expires and paying a fee 31 set by the department, which may not exceed \$50 \$100.

32 1. A certificateholder whose certificate has been on 33 inactive status for 1 year or less may renew his or her 34 certificate pursuant to the rules adopted by the department and 35 upon payment of a renewal fee set by the department, which may 36 not exceed \$50 \$100.

37 2. A certificateholder whose certificate has been on
38 inactive status for more than 1 year may renew his or her
39 certificate pursuant to rules adopted by the department.

40 3. A certificate that has been inactive for more than 641 years automatically expires and may not be renewed.

42 <u>(i)-(g)</u> The department shall establish by rule a procedure 43 for the initial certification of 911 <u>public safety</u> 44 <u>telecommunicators</u> emergency dispatchers as defined in this 45 section who have documentation of at least 5 years of supervised 46 full-time employment as a 911 <u>public safety telecommunicator or</u> 47 <u>an</u> emergency dispatcher since January 1, 2002. <u>This paragraph</u> 48 <u>expires October 1, 2012.</u>
