116 Funds appropriated for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, (5) 117 Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program shall be 118 distributed pursuant to this section to provide grants to 119 researchers seeking cures for cancer and cancer-related illnesses, with emphasis given to the goals enumerated in this 120 121 section s. 381.921. From the total funds appropriated, an amount 122 of up to 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses. In 123 the 2009-2010 fiscal year, 2.5 percent, not to exceed \$25 124 million, of the revenue deposited into the Health Care Trust 125 Fund pursuant to s. 215.5602(12)(a) shall be transferred to the 126 Biomedical Research Trust Fund within the Department of Health 127 for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer 128 Research Program.
