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(2) In order to promote public health and safety:

(a) All persons who use an automated external defibrillator are encouraged to obtain appropriate training, to include completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and demonstrated proficiency in the use of an automated external defibrillator.

29 Any person or entity in possession of an automated (b) external defibrillator is encouraged to notify the local 30 emergency medical services medical director of the location of 31 the automated external defibrillator. The owner, operator, or 32 33 administrator responsible for a place of public assembly, as defined in s. 768.1326, shall notify the local emergency medical 34 35 services medical director of the location of the automated 36 external defibrillator. The state agency responsible for a 37 building or portion of a building owned or leased by the state 38 shall notify the local emergency medical services medical director of the location of the automated external 39 40 defibrillator. The 74 Secretary of Management Services shall assist the State Surgeon 75 76 General in the development of the guidelines. The guidelines for 77 the placement of the automated external defibrillators shall 78 take into account the typical number of employees and visitors 79 in the building or place of public assembly buildings, the extent of the need for security measures regarding the building 80 81 or place of public assembly buildings, special circumstances in 82 the building or a portion of the building buildings or portions 83 of buildings such as high electrical voltages or extreme heat or cold, and such other factors as the State Surgeon General and 84 85 Secretary of Management Services determine to be appropriate. For purposes of this section, the term "place of public 86 assembly" means a location with a seating capacity of at least 87 1,000 people and includes, but is not limited to, any stadium, 88 89 ballpark, gymnasium, field house, arena, civic center, or 90 similar facility used for the conduct of sporting events and any concert hall, recital hall, theater, indoor or outdoor 91 92 amphitheatre, or other auditorium used for the presentation of 93 musical performances or concerts. The term does not include any church, synagogue, or other not-for-profit religious 94 95 organization or any public association or public library. The 96 State Surgeon General's recommendations for deployment of 97 automated external defibrillators in buildings or portions of

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98 buildings owned or leased by the state or in places of public 99 assembly shall include:

100 <u>(a) (1)</u> A reference list of appropriate training courses in 101 the use of such devices, including the role of cardiopulmonary 102 resuscitation;

103 (b)(2) The extent to which such devices may be used by 104 laypersons;

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In formulating these guidelines and recommendations, the State Surgeon General may consult with all appropriate public and private entities, including national and local public health organizations that seek to improve the survival rates of individuals who experience cardiac arrest.

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(2) This section may not be construed to:

(a) Prohibit a county or municipal government from enacting, implementing, and enforcing any local ordinance that expands the requirements of this section for the placement of automated external defibrillators in a place of pubic assembly; or
