A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the encroachment onto real property of others; providing that, in the absence of an easement or agreement, a person may not erect a building or other structure on his or her own land if any part of the building or structure encroaches upon the adjoining premises; requiring the landowner to remove the encroaching building or structure, or specified portions thereof; providing that the owner of the land encroached upon has a cause of action against the landowner who encroaches on the adjoining premises; providing for an award of injunctive relief, actual damages, costs, and attorney's fees to the prevailing party; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) In the absence of an easement or agreement, a person may not erect a building or other structure on his or her own land if any part of the building or structure, however small, extends beyond the person's legally recorded boundary, either above or below the surface, to encroach upon the adjoining premises.

(2) The owner of the land on which the encroaching building or structure is located shall remove all or that part of the building or structure which extends beyond the boundary.

(3) The owner of the land encroached upon has a cause of action in a court of competent jurisdiction against the landowner whose building or structure encroaches on the
