Section 1. Section 480.054, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

<u>480.054 Documents required for identification for</u> presentation to law enforcement officer while offering or providing massage services.—</u>

22	(2) Upon request by a law enforcement officer, a person who

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71	(7) A person may not use a massage establishment licensed

76	(8) A person who violates any provision of this section
77	commits:
78	(a) A misdemeanor of the second degree for the first
79	violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
80	(b) A misdemeanor of the first degree for the second
81	violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
82	(c) A felony of the third degree for the third or
83	subsequent violation, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s.
84	775.083, or s. 775.084.
85	Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2010.

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
