Subsection (6) of section 474.202, Florida 12 13 Statutes, is amended to read: 14 474.202 Definitions.-As used in this chapter: 15 "Limited-service veterinary vaccination clinic medical (6) 16 practice" means a veterinary practice at which a veterinarian 17 performs vaccinations or immunizations on multiple animals at a temporary location and operates for a limited time offering or 18 19 providing veterinary services at any location that has a primary 20 purpose other than that of providing veterinary medical service 21 at a permanent or mobile establishment permitted by the board; 22 provides veterinary medical services for privately owned animals 23 that do not reside at that location; operates for a limited 24 time; and provides limited types of veterinary medical services. 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for the operation of limited service veterinary <u>vaccination</u> <u>clinics</u> medical practices. Such rules shall not restrict limited service veterinary medical practices and shall be consistent with the type of limited veterinary <u>vaccination and immunization</u> services medical service provided.

(a) Any person that offers or provides limited service
veterinary <u>vaccination clinics</u> medical practice shall obtain a
biennial permit from the board the cost of which shall not
exceed \$250. The limited service permittee shall register each
location where a limited service <u>veterinary vaccination</u> clinic
is held and shall pay a fee set by rule not to exceed \$25 to
register each such location.

(b) All permits issued under this subsection are subject
to the provisions of ss. 474.213 and 474.214.

43 Notwithstanding any provision of this subsection to (C) 44 the contrary, any temporary rabies vaccination effort operated by a county health department in response to a public health 45 threat, as declared by the State Health Officer in consultation 46 47 with the State Veterinarian, is not subject to any preregistration, time limitation, or fee requirements, but must 48 49 adhere to all other requirements for limited service veterinary 50 vaccination clinics medical practice as prescribed by rule. The 51 fee charged to the public for a rabies vaccination administered 52 during such temporary rabies vaccination effort may not exceed the actual cost of administering the rabies vaccine. Such rabies 53 54 vaccination efforts may not be used for any purpose other than 55 to address the public health consequences of the rabies outbreak.
