20 Section 32. Subsection (2) of section 101.64, Florida 21 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (5) is added to that 22 section, to read:

101.64 Delivery of absentee ballots; envelopes; form.-

24 The certificate shall be arranged on the back of the (2)25 mailing envelope so that the line for the signature of the absent elector is across the seal of the envelope; however, no 26 27 statement shall appear on the envelope which indicates that a 28 signature of the voter must cross the seal of the envelope. The 29 absent elector shall execute the certificate on the envelope. The supervisor may not place on the mailing envelope any 30 31 information indicating the voter's party affiliation or noparty-affiliation status.

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33 (5) The mailing envelope for each absentee ballot must 34 include a postage paid indicia paid by the supervisor.

35 Section 33. Subsection (1) of section 101.657, Florida 36 Statutes, is amended to read:

101.657 Early voting.-

38 (1) (a) As a convenience to the voter, the supervisor of 39 elections shall allow an elector to vote early in the main or 40 branch office of the supervisor. The supervisor shall mark, code, indicate on, or otherwise track the voter's precinct for 41 each early voted ballot. In order for a branch office to be used 42 43 for early voting, it shall be a permanent facility of the

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44 supervisor and shall have been designated and used as such for 45 at least 1 year before prior to the election.

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46 The supervisor may also designate any city hall or (b) 47 permanent public library facility as an early voting site. To 48 the extent practicable sites; however, if so designated, the designated the sites must be geographically located so as to 49 50 provide all voters in the county an equal opportunity to cast a ballot, insofar as is practicable. The results or tabulation of 51 52 votes cast during early voting may not be made before the close 53 of the polls on election day. Results shall be reported by 54 precinct.

55 (c) (b) The supervisor shall designate each early voting 56 site by no later than the 60th 30th day before a primary prior to an election and shall designate an early voting area, as 57 defined in s. 97.021, at each early voting site. The supervisor 58 shall designate an adequate number of early voting sites such 59 that the approximate waiting time for an elector to vote at any 60 site does not exceed 15 minutes. Early voting sites for the 61 62 general election shall be held at the same sites designated for 63 a primary election.

(d) (c) All early voting sites in a county shall be open on
 the same days for the same amount of time and shall allow any
 person in line at the closing of an early voting site to vote.

Early voting sites shall 75 open <u>at no sooner than</u> 7 a.m. and close <u>at 9 p.m.</u> no later than 76 7 p.m. on each applicable day. <u>Early voting hours and days may</u> 77 <u>be extended only upon execution by the Governor of an executive</u> 78 <u>order declaring a state of emergency as authorized in s. 252.36.</u>

79 (f) (e) Notwithstanding the requirements of s. 100.3605, municipalities may provide early voting in municipal elections 80 that are not held in conjunction with county or state elections. 81 82 If a municipality provides early voting, it may designate as many sites as necessary and shall conduct its activities in 83 84 accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (a)-(d) $\frac{(a)-(c)}{(a)-(c)}$. The supervisor is not required to conduct early voting if it is 85 provided pursuant to this subsection. 86

(g) (f) Notwithstanding the requirements of s. 189.405, 87 special districts may provide early voting in any district 88 89 election not held in conjunction with county or state elections. 90 If a special district provides early voting, it may designate as 91 many sites as necessary and shall conduct its activities in 92 accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (a)-(d) $\frac{(a)-(c)}{(a)}$. 93 The supervisor is not required to conduct early voting if it is 94 provided pursuant to this subsection.

95 (h) The results or tabulation of votes cast during early 96 voting may not be disclosed before the close of the polls on 97 election day. Results shall be reported by precinct.
