Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Section 220.194, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
 - 220.194 Employment of former felons tax credit.-
- (1) There shall be a credit of \$1,000 allowed against the tax imposed by this chapter for wages paid to a person who has been convicted of a felony in this state and released from confinement if the following conditions are met:
- (a) The individual must have been employed on a full-time basis for a period of 6 months or more.
- (b) An employer may not have previously received a credit under this section for employment of that person.
- (2) The tax credit under this section is not available for employment of a person who is:
- (a) Classified as a violent career criminal, habitual felony offender, habitual violent felony offender, or three-time violent felony offender under s. 775.084.
- (b) Subject to registration as a sexual predator under s. 775.21.
