Section 252.515, Florida Statutes, is created 15 to read: 16 252.515 Postdisaster Relief Assistance Act; immunity from 17 civil liability.-18 This act may be cited as the "Postdisaster Relief (1)19 Assistance Act." 20 Any person who gratuitously and in good faith provides (2) 21 temporary housing, food, water, or electricity to emergency 22 first responders or the immediate family members of emergency 23 first responders in response to an emergency situation related 24 to and arising out of a public health emergency declared 25 pursuant to s. 381.00315 or a state of emergency declared 26 pursuant to s. 252.36, may not be held liable for any civil 27 damages as a result of providing the temporary housing, food, 28 water, or electricity unless the person acts in a manner that

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57 of an emergency by the Governor, unless the declared state of 58 emergency is extended by the Governor, in which case the immunity provided by this section continues to apply for the 59 60 duration of the extension and 6 months thereafter; or 61 (b) That is unrelated to the original declared emergency 62 or any extension thereof. 63 (5) As used in this section, the term "reckless disregard" 64 means such conduct that a reasonable person knew or should have 65 known, at the time such services were provided, would be likely to result in injury so as to affect the life or health of 66 67 another, taking into account the extent or serious nature of the 68 prevailing circumstances. 69 (6) A person may register with a county emergency 70 management agency as a temporary provider of housing, food, 71 water, or electricity for emergency first responders if the 72 county provides for such registration. A person who has 73 registered with a county emergency management agency as a 74 provider of temporary housing, food, water, or electricity to 75 emergency first responders or the immediate family members of 76 emergency first responders is presumed to have acted in good 77 faith in providing such housing, food, water, or electricity.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.

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
